# **Funds Received for Building Repairs**

U.S. Representative Mike Doyle presented a check for \$97,000 to the Board of Trustees of the C.C. Mellor Memorial Library and Edgewood Community House on August 23. The money will be used for exterior repairs to the building, including new windows, painting, rebuilding the brick steps at the corner entrance, and installing a terra cotta patio.

The funding was secured through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Economic Development Initiative.

The building, which is home to both the C.C. Mellor Memorial Library and the non-profit Edgewood Club, was designed by Edward B. Lee and formally opened in 1918. Franklin Toker, the author of Pittsburgh: An Urban Portrait has called the building "a public monument" and "one of the best public buildings in the city."



#### Street Paving

Street paving is complete and hopefully everyone has noticed the improvement to Race Street. We also paved the Elm Street parking lot and expanded its size by three spaces. We will continue to try to do this in every lot in an attempt to lessen the numbers of cars on the street. We continue work on Alley C (which runs behind South Braddock Avenue). The Public Works Department has literally been repairing and rebuilding the entire brick alley. We will get to some hot-patching this fall. We have identified several areas where we will be concentrating.

#### Koenig Flood

We continue to work aggressively on the flooding situation at Koenig Field. This is a problem caused by the Wilkinsburg sewer line and after several meetings with the Health Department it appears they are finally going to be very strict with Wilkinsburg in requiring that problem be addressed. We believe we have a clear understanding what is causing the problem and the Health Department seems to agree with us. I will continue to provide updates in future newsletters.

#### July Activity Report

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,789 calls for service in July 2005. There were 508 incidents reported, 248 complaints received and seven accidents investigated, of which one resulted in personal injury.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 30 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, three were burglary, 16 were shoplifting and eight were other crimes.

There were 19 adult and six juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 43 traffic citations, 381 parking citations and made two arrests for driving under the influence. There were vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and three narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 23 false alarm calls, took 280 reports, responded to 20 public nuisance complaints, wrote four non-traffic citations and responded to 12 calls for medical assistance.
