Foundation Brings New Christmas Classic to Edgewood Club Stage

Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus. And he – and his understudy – will be visiting Edgewood in a production of “Winter Solstice,” a new holiday classic that is based on the myths of the Gift Bearer of the Winter Solstice. This heartwarming play was called “charming and witty” by *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* drama critic Chris Rawson.

Sponsored by the Edgewood Foundation, the play is produced by mimeradio.org, a company that produces live shows and internet audio theater. The play will be directed by lance-eric skapura, who directed its previous two productions.

Show dates are December 2, 3, 9 and 10 at 8 p.m., with a special preview as part of Light Up Night on Thursday, December 1 (see page 5). All performances will be held at the Edgewood Club.

Written by Walnut Street resident Marjorie Stewart, the play features actors well known to Pittsburgh theatergoers, including Brian Bessor, Heather McNeish, James Shobert and Nicole O'Malley. Edgewood theater buffs may also recognize the talents of Lynn Franks, who was seen in *Vanities*, which we believe was the final production of the Edgewood Players, produced at the Edgewood Club in 1987.

The play asks the age-old question, Who is Santa Claus? Well, Virginia, this bittersweet comedy contends that it's Mr. von Kinder, the old high school driving teacher. And soon it will be Alexandra Milanovich, hard-boiled girl reporter. And it used to be La Befana, or the Christ Kindle, or Santa Lucia, or St. Nicholas, or...or...or...

The show will feature live original music by composer/performer Stephen Vesolich, and a light appetizer and dessert buffet.

Edgewood to Convert to Allegheny County Dispatching Jan. 1

Edgewood Borough Council recently voted to transition its dispatching services to the Allegheny County 911 Center beginning January 1, 2006. If you have been keeping track of recent events involving the county's 911 service and the regional centers, this action was not entirely unexpected.

Edgewood has had a unique set-up with its dispatching services and that department's relationship with the Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department. Currently, if you dial 911, that call goes to the Eastern Regional Center in Monroeville. They then ring the call down to Edgewood where we have our own dispatch department. This process, while seamless, can delay an operator being on the phone by several seconds. As most residents learn, Edgewood does have its own emergency line that residents can dial and those do come directly to us.

To add to this already confusing set-up if a resident would dial Edgewood's emergency line and need an ambulance, that call gets sent to the Monroeville center who is responsible

for all ambulance dispatch.

Our dispatchers are also responsible for taking fire trucks to any fire scene. When this happens, all calls are forwarded to the Monroeville 911 center. If during this time you were to call our emergency number, you would actually be talking to a dispatcher from Monroeville.

All the area's regional call centers will be closed as of December 31, 2005. For Edgewood that means that we would have no one to transfer our calls to during a fire call. It also means that our borough would have no one dispatching ambulance service. Edgewood Borough Council was left with little choice but to agree to convert dispatching to the county beginning in January.

Internally we have been planning for this since March. We believe that Edgewood residents will see no reduction in service. There will be changes in the way that we do some things. Currently the plan is to keep what is our dispatch department, but rework their responsibilities. This new depart-

ment will continue to assist the police department and take the fire truck out when a fire call comes in. They also will deal with payment of parking tickets, handling overnight call-ins, and many other duties.

This new department will be staffed from 7:30 a.m. - 11:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. We will have no issues with getting fire trucks to the scenes during the overnight hours and on the weekends. The Edgewood Fire Chief has already begun implementing call sheets where neighboring departments are helping our town with fire coverage. We have also seen the size of our volunteer company grow by about 25% just this year. There will be other changes the borough will have to implement during these overnight and weekend hours, including paying tickets and overnight call-ins. Please refer to our web-site in the coming weeks for specifics, as well as area newspapers. Please rest assured that there is no higher priority for us than the safety of our residents.

Nine Mile Run Group Seeks Input

The Nine Mile Run Watershed Association will sponsor a family friendly two-day public visioning workshop to help their team of engineers, landscape architects, and artists redesign the Braddock Avenue entrance to Frick Park. The goal is to transform dilapidated parking lots, chain link fencing, and a decaying outfall culvert into a welcoming entrance to Frick Park and the Center for Creative Play.

Stop the press!

First and foremost, the photo seen in last month's newsletter is not the ladder truck. That is engine 137. There are no plans of retiring the engine for a long time coming. As the deadline approaches for this article I always wonder, what do I say. Marjorie - thank you for being the inspiration behind this article entitled "Meet Your Fire Trucks."

Engine 137 (*editor's note - see October issue for photo. And oops, sorry, Dave!*) is a 2000 Pierce Dash. The engine carries 1000' feet of five-inch hose which is used to bring water from the hydrant into the pump. The pump has a capacity of putting out 2000 gallons per minute. For fighting fires we use 1 1/2" hand lines. There are two 150' section pre-connected to the pump. There is an additional 400' that is carried as back up.

The engine also has a 500-gallon water tank which is used for smaller fires. In addition to fire suppression, this engine was designed to carry a compli-

ment of rescue equipment. We carry the Jaws of Life, cutters, rams (not the furry kind), saws alls, air chisel, air shores, rope, and wood blocks for stabilization. There are fans to blow smoke out or cool fire fighters down. Large and small hand tools range from axes down to screwdrivers. There are three types of meters to read gasses as well as a wand to detect if electrical lines still have power in them.

So now you know what goes on behind closed doors. Squad 137 is a 1999 Ford Explorer and due to its size is generally used for transporting fire fighters and carrying minor equipment. It also does a fine job to fine job pulling the hay wagon. Stay tuned for next year's update on "Meet Your Fire Trucks."

New Speed Limit

The speed limit the entire length of Maple Avenue has recently been reduced from 25 miles per hour to 15 miles per hour. In order to increase public awareness of the reduced speed limit, Edgewood Police Department has obtained the use of a speed trailer which was placed on Maple Avenue in October. The borough would also like to congratulate part-time police officer Troy Garrett who resigned from the borough in October for a full-time position with the Allegheny County Sheriff's Department. Officer Garrett was employed with Edgewood for about four years. We would like to thank Officer Garrett for his dedication to the borough throughout his employment, and wish him best of luck in his new position.

October Police Statistics

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,815 calls for service in October. There were 573 incidents reported, 222 complaints received and one accident investigated, which resulted in personal injury.

Part I Crimes

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 24 part I crimes committed in the borough, four were burglary, ten were shoplifting and nine were other crimes.

Arrests

There were seven adult and no juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Traffic Incidents

Edgewood officers conducted a total of 164 traffic stops, wrote a total of 109 traffic citations, four non-traffic citations, 320 parking tags and made one arrest for driving under the influence. There were three vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and two narcotics offenses.

Other Calls

Officers also responded to 28 false alarm calls, took 263 reports, responded to six public nuisance complaints and responded to 17 calls for medical assistance.
