Great PA Cleanup Project Begins at Home

For the third year in a row, Edgewood will join groups and individuals all across the state in the Great PA Cleanup. The event will be held on Saturday, April 22. Always held in conjunction with Earth Day, this year the cleanup falls directly on the thirty-sixth annual observance of this day to recommit to stewardship of our natural resources.

Edgewood's part of this project begins with coffee and doughnuts at Koenig Field House at 9 a.m.. Volunteers will be divided into cleanup teams assigned to areas of the borough in need of picking up, sweeping up, and sprucing up. Trash bags and safety vests have been provided by the state. Participants are asked to bring their own gloves and hats, drinking water, and sunscreen. The clean up will go on until noon, rain or shine.

The state-wide effort sets the ambitious goal of removing litter from the state's roadways, parks, riverbanks and open spaces. The Great PA Cleanup website says, "Everyone wants to live, work and play in a clean & green community... and its up to everyone to make it possible and improve the overall quality of life for us all."

The cleanup site also lists these effects of litter on a community:

- **Litter is dangerous** – Broken glass cuts people, plastic chokes and kills animals, chemicals pollute streams.
- **Litter is unsightly** – Trash and litter ruin property values and lower the quality of life for everyone.
- **Litter is contagious** – Illegal dumps invite more dumping, turning country roads into garbage piles, and spoiling parks and recreation areas.
- **Litter is expensive** – Litter costs Pennsylvania taxpayers more than \$20 million dollars each year. PennDOT spends \$10.1 million each year just on roadside cleanups. Cleanup of illegal dumps costs \$835/ton. Cleaning up litter is nine times more expensive than collecting it from trash receptacles.

Registered participants (individuals and groups) in the cleanup event can enter to win a weekend getaway in Pennsylvania, as well as a hybrid-powered vehicle offered as part of a national sweepstake. Race Street Staged as Martian Landing Area Conspiracy Theorists Plan Edgewood Visit to Confirm

Needed items include cereals (high fiber, low sugar), canned stews, canned meat, canned tuna, peanut butter, canned vegetables, paper products, canned fruit; household commodities, and soap (laundry and bath). The campaign is not prepared to accept perishable items or food in glass jars.

Scouts will return to your neighborhood on Saturday, April 29 to collect your food contributions will be returned to the First Presbyterian Church of Edgewood to help meet the needs of our hungry neighbors.

Activity Report February 2006

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,740 calls for service in February 2006. There were 495 incidents reported, 268 complaints

received and four accidents investigated, none of which resulted in personal injury, but all four resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 16 Part I burglary, nine were shoplifting and three were other crimes.

There were seven adult and no juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 146 traffic citations, 260 parking citations and made one arrest for driving under the influence was made. There were four vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and one narcotics offense.

Officers also responded to 18 false alarm calls, took 262 reports, responded to 32 public nuisance complaints, wrote three non-traffic citations and responded to 16 calls for medical assistance.


