Edgewood Police Chief to Retire in January

Edgewood was saddened when Police Chief Paul Wood announced his retirement, effective January 4, 2008. Chief Wood has served the last five years of his 45 years in the policing profession as Edgewood's chief, and made his mark in the department and in the neighborhood. Chief Wood previously served as Police Chief in Roseville, Michigan; Hagerstown, Maryland; and for three years in Wilkinsburg.

A former US Marine and seventh-degree black belt in Tae Kwon Do, the formidable Chief Wood had a task just as formidable...repairing a broken police department. When Wood began, there were four full-time officers, two police vehicles, no locker room, outdated or substandard equipment, and a lack of policies regarding everything from police uniforms to taser use.

Under the Chief's leadership, there are now eleven full-time officers including two sergeants; five new police vehicles with onboard computers; male and female locker rooms and a staff sergeant's room; and a comprehensive police policy manual which is

now being brought up to National Police Accreditation standards.

The Edgewood Police are now more visible in the community, thanks to new programs Wood implemented such as the Citizens' Police Academy, Police Open Houses, and stronger relationships with schools and community groups. Wood also began yearly performance evaluations on the police officers and instituted staff training on weapons, crisis management and more. Morale has never been higher on the police force.

In 2007, Chief Wood was named "Edgewood Person of the Year" by the Woodland Hills Progress, and the Edgewood Department was one of six departments in the state to be awarded AAA's Platinum Traffic Safety Award.

The search process has begun for a new chief, and is expected to be thorough and to involve Wood as long as he is still in Edgewood.

As Public Safety Chair, I believe we will have been left in a very strong position. There are now solid procedures in place which will make running the department a lot smoother for the next chief.

The council and Mayor Jean Davin recognize that while everyone wishes Chief Wood well and understands that his retirement is well-deserved, we will all be sorry to see him go. "It's a big loss to the borough," said Mayor Davin. "Paul Wood's positive influence will be felt here for a very long time."



Johnston Building Renovation

In last month's newsletter the front page featured the wonderful restoration of the Johnston Building on Swissvale Avenue by Lami Grubb Architects. In 1934 my grandmother, Caroline Gasaway Grubbs, wrote a history of the Borough of Edgewood. Would like to quote what she wrote about the Johnston block:

"When I came to Edgewood (circa 1900) and coming from the city where mail service was taken for granted the democratic institution of the Village Post Office intrigued me. I never failed to admire the speed and accuracy Mr. Johnston turned from letters to lettuce, from papers to produce, and sugar and salt to the sale of a stamps. Mr. Johnston effected quite a change in the landscape when he decided on his building operations, for he moved the house on the corner of Maple and Swissvale occupied by Capt. and Mrs. Bigger being the house which the Johnston family still occupy."

I'm not too sure that many people realize that in the fifties both the grocery store and the meat market were operated by C.L. Johnston. There was a passageway behind the Nuzzo shop that connected the two operations. The Society would like to start a file on Johnston family and would welcome any input from descendents of C.L. Budget Time

The end of the year always marks a flurry of activity around the borough. The 2008 budget process has been underway since October. Council will vote on the final budget on December 17. Even though the final budget has not been passed I can tell you there will be no tax increase. The borough has gone over a decade without a millage increase. I believe that is a remarkable achievement. If you factor what has happened with costs associated with health care, fuel, garbage, and it seems everything else, we have done exceptionally well. In 2008 health care costs are increasing 38%, rock salt 26%, and garbage pick-up 19%.

Garbage Fees

There is something important to realize about our garbage services. Back in 2003 the borough rolled our garbage fee into our millage. It was a dollar for dollar exchange whereby the mills were adjusted exactly to offset the garbage fee. Residents no longer received an annual garbage bill. The annual fee in 2003 was \$78 per household. The current millage rate of 6.661 is reflective of a garbage fee of \$78 a year. Our 2008 annual per unit cost of garbage will be \$133.56. We have had no tax increases offsetting what has been a 71% increase in garbage fees over the last five years.

investigated, one of which resulted in personal injury, and nine of which resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 24 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, one was burglary, 17 were shoplifting, and six were other crimes.

There were six adult and three juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 112 traffic citations and 230 parking citations. One arrest for driving under the influence was made. There were two vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and two narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 14 false alarm calls, took 436 reports, responded to 21 public nuisance complaints, wrote four non-traffic citations and responded to 15 calls for medical assistance.



Important Property Tax Information

If you own property in the Woodland Hills School District, you might qualify for a property tax reduction under the Pennsylvania Taxpaver Relief Act signed into law on June 27, 2006, commonly referred to as Act 1. You should be receiving a letter from the school district informing you that property tax relief may be immediate for residents who qualify for property tax/rent rebate refunds from the state.

Since the Woodland Hills School District must participate in Act 1, the school district real estate tax reduction will not come in the form of a rebate check, but will be a reduced real estate assessment noted on your school district property tax bill. This reduction is not automatic. Property owners must file an application with the Allegheny County Assessment Office. Applications must be approved by Allegheny County to be eligible for possible property tax relief.

Homestead/Farmstead Exclusion applications will be mailed to property owners by the school district, but if you do not receive one, you can pick one up at the Administration building at 2430 Greensburg Pike. You can also call the Allegheny County Assessment Office at (412) 350-4600 for an application or to get answers to your questions. been extended to March 1. You can expect to receive notification regarding your approval or denial from the county assessor within 30 days after the receipt of your application. If for any reason your application is denied, you will be given an opportunity to appeal
