
Strawberry Festival

ed, none of which resulted in personal injury, and nine of which resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 34 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, one was robbery, two were burglary, 19 were shoplifting, five were aggravated assault and seven were other crimes.

There were 19 adult and no juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 101 traffic citations and 350 parking citations, and made four arrests for driving under the influence. There was one vandalism/criminal mischief complaint and one narcotics offense.

Officers also responded to eight false alarm calls, took 225 reports, responded to 24 public nuisance complaints, wrote one non-traffic citation and responded to 10 calls for medical assistance.

The Safety Tip

While surfing the net I found an interesting article on propane tanks. See: http://www.snopes.com/crime/ warnings/methtank.asp. It seems that meth lab "professors" are using propane cylinders for anhydrous ammonia. This chemical is not compatible with brass and will corrode the valve and fitting. This will cause the valve to leak as well as weaken the strength of the tank. If you have your own tank this won't be a problem. If you use the exchange tanks for propane, examine the valve look for a distinctive bluegreen corrosion on the brass, evidence of tampering with the threads and any ammonia odor around the cylinder. 

About three months ago, the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette ran an article discussing suburban municipal debt in Allegheny County. In my opinion that article was incomplete. It lumped communities together by looking at an annual DCED report submitted by municipal auditors. The article reportthat communities such Edgewood, Oakmont, Fox Chapel, and Mt. Lebanon were in over their heads based on vague standards associated with debt ratios for municipalities.


Channel 4 ran what it called an investigative report this past week on municipal debt as well. It indicated that communities with debt amounting to 10% of their annual budgets were in trouble. I have not seen that number used as a benchmark in all my time dealing with municipal finances.

While the Channel 4 report did not mention Edgewood specifically, it did refer to Edgewood in its online report, which consisted of listing communities and their total annual debt amount. It listed Edgewood's debt as approximately 11% of its annual budget.

I think it is important to clarify this superficial analysis for the Borough of Edgewood since no opportunity was

provided by Channel 4. First, their analysis rolled all of Edgewood's debt into one category and that is very misleading. A significant portion of our debt is not even paid for out of our general fund. Also, much of the remaining debt the borough has in its general fund is short term in nature.

- 1. 42.6% of Edgewood's outstanding debt is paid for out of our sewage fund and not from our general fund. This debt then is paid for by user fees. This debt was the result of a sewer project the borough completed replacing 1,200 feet of sewer lines on Race Street. If we use WTAE's analysis indicating that 11% of our annual budget is debt and we rightfully subtract this amount Edgewood's debt is now under 7% of our general fund budget. Conversely, if we would add Edgewood's user fees from the sewer fund into the revenue side of their analysis, Edgewood's overall debt would be calculated at a little less than 5%.
- 2. 11.25% of Edgewood's debt is very short term in nature and will be paid off by 2011. In fact Edgewood will pay off its 5-year loan for a DPW

pickup truck in 2009. One of our loans for our pumper truck will be paid off in May, 2010 and are two (2) other new DPW trucks have three annual remaining payments meaning they will be paid off in 2011.


The borough also has an outstanding loan that was used to renovate the Koenig Field bathrooms several years back. The \$785.28 quarterly payment will be repaid in September, 2009.

Edgewood's long-term debt, which I will define as 10 years or more, translates to less 5% of our annual general fund budget.

The borough will be facing what amounts to a \$50,000 debt in 2016 because there will be 27 pays during the year. Borough council has had the foresight to set aside one day's pay every year, as part of the budget, to handle this added expense. In 2016 when other municipalities are scrambling to come up with this money we will already have it set-aside.

Finally, there are a variety of other factors that should be considered when determining the overall fiscal health of a municipality that were lacking in both the Post-Gazette article and the recent Channel 4 telecast:

1. We have no outstanding bond issues.



- 3. We have a healthy cash reserve in our sewage fund and liquid fuels
- 4. We have comprehensive insurance covering the Borough for nominal losses as well as catastrophic events.
- 5. We have an infrastructure that overall is in outstanding condition.
- 6. While millage changed in the early 2000's as a response to unpredictable property values (and changed from 5.857 to 6.661 in 2003, but only because we eliminated the garbage fee) essentially taxes remain unchanged 12 years.
- 7. The two long-term debts the borough has incurred where in response to a specific need in the borough; a deteriorated sewer line and new rescue truck for the fire department.

My point to all of this is to assure our residents that these items; the quality of our infrastructure, our cash flow, our debt ratios, our programs, and our potential need to go into any additional debt is all being aggressively monitored and please rest assured that we in fact are an extremely healthy borough.

3# Italian hot sausage

11/2# onions, sliced

1 green pepper, sliced (or to taste)

15 oz. can tomato sauce

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place sausage in a large roaster, turning occasionally to brown.

Remove sausage from oven and slice in half longwise (if desired).

Remove excess fat from roaster, leaving just a film.


Return sausage to roaster and add sliced onions, sliced peppers and stir.


