

#### Post Card Exhibit

There will be an exhibit of post cards of the Taft-Bryan election of 1908 in the History Society memorabilia cases at the C.C. Mellor Library. The post card was the media of electioneering one hundred years ago. It was also considered the high water mark of the post card in the world especially in America. In 1908, Congress passed the third post card law that divided the back of the post card and permitted a full picture. This created what was known at the post card craze. It is estimated five hundred billion post cards were mailed that year.

#### Safety Corner

Don't forget to have your furnace checked by a certified furnace company as well as any wood burning devices you may be using to heat your house. Carbon monoxide is colorless, odorless and tasteless gas that is deadly. Install carbon monoxide monitors near each sleeping area as well as smoke detectors. Smoke detectors should also be installed inside each sleeping area as well as every level of your home. The reason for installing them in the sleeping areas is that the activation in the room is more audible than through a closed door.

#### Halloween Safety

Please keep in mind that Halloween is quickly approaching. Edgewood Borough will celebrate Trick or Treat on Friday, October 31 from 6-8 p.m. With that in mind, the following safety tips are being offered to parents, children and homeowners:



#### Parents

- Children of any age should be accompanied by an adult.
- If your children go out on their own, be sure they wear a watch, preferably one that can be read in the dark.
- If a costume is worn, look for one made of flame-retardant material.
- Children should know where to reach you and when to be home.
- You should know where they are going. Learn the route they will take.
- Although tampering is rare, tell children to bring the candy home to be inspected before eating anything.

#### Homeowners

- Make sure your yard is clear of such things as ladders, hoses, dog leashes and flowerpots that can trip the young ones.
- If you have pets, make sure you keep them away from the door, so that they don't dart outside when you are giving out candy.
- Secure any hanging decorations so that they don't fall onto your guests or into your jack-o-lanterns.

#### Children

- Carry a flashlight, glow stick, or other similar device.
- Only Trick or Treat during the allotted hours (6-8 p.m.).
- Always have someone with you; never go to a house alone.
- Never go into a house for "more candy" or anything else.




- Stay in familiar neighborhoods.

#### South Braddock Avenue

Now that South Braddock Avenue has been paved and school has started, we have stepped up our traffic enforcements in this area. We are asking all residents to obey the posted speed limit of 25 miles per hour. Officers have been seeing an increase in the number of speeding motorists in this area and have issued hundreds of speeding citations in the past few months. If you are driving through the Regent Square area, please slow down.

We would also like to remind our residents that when walking the business district you should obey the "Walk & Don't Walk" signals. While vehicles must yield to pedestrians, sadly, this is not always the case. We ask that all pedestrians cross the street inside the crosswalks and in accordance with "Walk" signals.



#### Activity Report

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 2,188 calls for service in August 2008. There were 736 incidents reported, 299complaints received and four accidents investigated, none of which resulted in personal injury, and four of which resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 23 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, none were robbery or burglary, one was motor vehicle theft, none were shoplifting, none were aggravated assault and ten were other crimes.

There were 24 adult and 13 juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 136 traffic citations, 282 parking citations and made seven arrests for driving under the influence. There were six vandalism/criminal mischief complaint sand no narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 19 false alarm calls, took 387 reports, responded to 26 public nuisance complaints, wrote 20 non-traffic citations and responded to 16 calls for medical assistance.



## Tax Time

#### **Borough Taxes**

The Edgewood Borough Real Estate tax is due at penalty. I will not be sending out reminders, so check and make sure yours was paid. This bill came out in the spring. If you are not sure, call me and I can check on it for you. This tax will be turned over to PAMS in December. Once it is turned over there will be additional penalties added on plus interest.

#### School Taxes

The Woodland Hills School tax is due at face until October 31. Please remember, if you didn't pay your first installment by August 31, I cannot accept an installment payment now. If you did pay in installments, you should have received your second and third bills in the mail by now. If you didn't get them, call me. My number is (412) 731-0200. Also, if you are late on one or more installments this year by 10 days or more, you will not be allowed to pay in installments next year.
