



WPSD to Provide Services to Deaf Students in Northeast PA

On May 8, Education Secretary Gerald L. Zahorchak, announced that an agreement had been reached between the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf (WPSD) that provides for the continuation of a school for deaf and hard-ofhearing children in northeast Pennsylvania.

"We were approached by PDE to provide educational services to these students as part of the state's commitment to serving the needs of deaf and hard-of-hearing students," said Donald E. Rhoten, WPSD Superintendent.

"WPSD will establish the Scranton School for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children – a program of the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf - on the Scranton State School for the Deaf campus as of July 1, 2009. We are committed to maintaining a program in Northeast Pennsylvania on a long-term basis." Details of PDE's transition plan can be found at www.pde.state.pa.us. WPSD currently provides quality educational services and a complete extracurricular program to nearly 250 deaf and hard-of-hearing children from 101 school districts and 31 counties, including Bucks, Montgomery, Lancaster, York, Lycoming and Union. WPSD operates an office in Camp Hill, PA that serves as a center for outreach and support programs for the area's deaf community and as the transportation center for residential students from central and eastern PA.



Activity Report—April 2009

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,801 calls for service in April. There were 565 incidents reported, 232 complaints received and nine accidents investigated, one of which resulted in personal injury, and eight resulted in property damage.

crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 24 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, there were 0 for robbery and motor vehicle theft, one for burglary, 19 for shoplifting, one for aggravated assault and three other crimes.

There were 19 adult and three juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 86 traffic citations, 311 parking citations and nine arrests for driving under the influence were made. There were two vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and one narcotics offense.

Officers also responded to 13 false alarm calls, took 289 reports, responded to 33 public nuisance complaints, wrote seven non-traffic citations and responded to 12 calls for medical assistance.

Safety First

With the summer months comes the hazard of outdoor injury. Grills should be placed away from structures so as not to endanger them. If you are storing your gas can in a garage, I strongly recommend a safety can, they do cost a little more, but keep in mind the cost of building materials is also pricey. If at all possible, store gas outside, away from your structure.


