Residents who live along the course should be warned that the streets will be closed from approximately 7 a.m. until the last runner passes by, which is usually by 10 a.m. Parade route streets will be closed until after the 11 a.m. parade. For those living along both routes, it is important to move your car away from the course if you need to leave during the event.

The Edgewood 5K is in its 25th year and has a reputation as a challenging but fun course. The race originators laid the route out to fall entirely within Edgewood, and it features some of the borough's most beautiful streets. #### Drop Dead Book Club




brate its 140th Anniversary and 125 years at the Edgewood campus.

On September 4, 1869 the first day school for deaf children in the United States opened with nine deaf pupils at the First Ward Public School in Pittsburgh. Today, WPSD is still a tuition-free school with high academic expectations. Over 250 children from birth through twelfth grade are served through the campus in Edgewood. Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, WPSD will administer the education and extra-curricular programs for the Scranton School for Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing Children (SSDHHC) with over 90 children enrolled from preschool through twelfth grade.

One thing has remained unchanged since 1869, and that is the school's commitment to educational excellence and the physical and social well being of deaf and hard-of-hearing children. From the very beginning, the mission of the school has been to offer these children every opportunity to succeed in life.



# Wet Weather and the Effect on our Sanitary Sewer System

After the storm on June 17, many of our residents experienced flooding from the excessive amount of rain that fell in a two hour time frame. Some of the flooding was caused by excessive ground water flow, and some was caused by the surcharging of our sanitary sewer system.

According to the 3 Rivers Wet Weather web site, frequent rainfall and melting snow can cause raw sewage to overflow into the area's rivers and streams. One tenth of an inch of rain can cause this to happen and Pittsburgh receives an average rainfall of one-quarter inch.

Our sewers transport wastewater from our homes to the wastewater treatment plant efficiently during dry weather. The problem occurs when rain or melted snow gets in the sewer pipes through direct connections, and through leaky or cracked pipes. The extra rain water overloads the sewer pipes and raw sewage overflows into waterways, from manholes or even into basements.

#### Edgewood Train Station Update

I have received many inquiries about the status of the Edgewood Train Station. On July 22, bids were opened for exterior renovations to the station. This work will include the replacement of all doors and windows, the installation of new shake shingles and the restoration or repainting of the brick. Also we are working in conjunction with the Nine Mile Run Watershed Association and the Edgewood Garden Club to install a rain garden on the site. 
#### New Tools Allow You to Check Status of Property Tax/ Rent Rebates

Eligible older adults and residents with disabilities can now check the status of their property tax/rent rebate applications online at www.paproperty taxrelief.com.

Six weeks after submitting a property tax/rent rebate application, the applicant may visit the website and check the status of the rebate by entering his/her Social Security number, anticipated rebate amount and birth date. Applicants may use the website to confirm claim status, rebate amount and the date a rebate is expected to be mailed or direct deposited. Distribution of rebate checks began on July 1.

Through a similar automated phone service, property tax/rent rebate applicants can check rebate status by calling, toll-free, 1-888-PATAXES.

The 2009 Woodland Hills School tax bill was mailed out the first of July. The new millage is 25.651. This bill is due at discount by August 31, which is a Monday. I will be in the office the week of August 17, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m., and also the week of the August 24, Monday through Friday. If you have not received your bill yet, please call my office at (412) 731-0200. Also, if you have refinanced or changed your mortgage company, call me to give me the change and report it to the Allegheny County tax office at (412) 350-4100. If you are paying in installments, make sure you send the bill in with the payment so you will receive your other two installment bills. These will be sent out sometime in September.

The Edgewood Borough Real Estate tax is now due at penalty. These bills were mailed out the first of April. Remember, it is your responsibility as a homeowner to make sure you have received your bill. I have no control over the mail once it goes to the post office. I hope everyone is having a great summer!

If you like to sleep in on Saturday, or if you will be on vacation during this time, please plan ahead and make other parking arrangements.

The Edgewood Police Department will again host a crime prevention booth. Safety tips on crime prevention and literature about various programs that are sponsored by the police department throughout the year can be obtained at the booth. Stop by and say hello! While you're there, don't forget to sign your child up for the raffle which is held each year by the department. Several desirable prizes will be given away, so be sure to sign your child up. #### Activity Report

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,645 calls for service in May 2009. There were 544 incidents reported, 214 complaints received and 10 accidents investigated. Three of these resulted in personal injury, and seven resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 22 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, there was one for robbery, zero for motor vehicle theft and burglary, 17 for shoplifting, two for aggravated assault and two other crimes.

There were 16 adult and one juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.



Edgewood officers wrote a total of 65 traffic citations and 300 parking citations. Five arrests for driving under the influence were made. There were six vandalism/criminal mischief complaints and two narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to 19 false alarm calls, took 230 reports, responded to 22 public nuisance complaints, wrote five non-traffic citations and responded to 15 calls for medical assistance.
