New Program Brings Resident Firefighters to Borough

In May, the Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department will begin a live-in program designed to increase the number of volunteers within the borough limits. Of the twenty-five volunteer firefighters in the department, only three live in Edgewood. "Because we have so few firefighters living in the borough, the goal of the program is to have two to three firefighters living here at all times," said Lieutenant Ben Reynolds. "The candidates will get free lodging and in exchange they will respond to fire and rescue calls in Edgewood Borough."

The first participant in the program is University of Pittsburgh freshman, Charles Pratt. He is seeking a B.S. in emergency medicine and taking fire-fighter classes. "I hope to get some emergency response experience since that's the career field I'm going in to," Charles said. Originally from Ithaca, New York, he has been a member of the Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department since December.

"A live-in program is a huge recruitment and retention tool," Ben said. "For a college student who has to go to school and work, finding time to volunteer may be difficult. We take some of the burden off by providing a place for them to live." Ben added that he only knows of three other programs in the area.

The department is looking for two more candidates for the program. To qualify, a candidate must be accepted as a member of the Edgewood Borough Fire Department. If they are in the FireVEST scholarship program their grade point average has to be a 2.0 or higher. They also have to have taken Essentials of Firefighting at the Allegheny County Fire Academy and get their certification to operate the rescue vehicles

The volunteers will be housed on the second floor of the borough building. The living quarters there were originally used to house the fire chief prior to 1961 when Edgewood had a paid fire department. Since the quarters have not been used in many years, members of the fire department are in

the process of cleaning, painting, fixing and remodeling the space. The quarters consist of a dormitory style bunk room, a day room, kitchen, bathroom and dining area. So far, the department has a leather couch, pair of recliners and two twin beds to furnish the space. They are seeking donations of a bunk bed, armoires or lockers, a coffee table or end tables, floor lamps, twin bed sheets, bath vanity, shower tile and kitchen appliances. Since the existing carpet can't be removed easily they also need area rugs to cover the old carpeting. The department is also hoping to secure a combo dining/ game table for the dining area and a bar style table and chairs for the members to use their laptops on. If you would like to donate any of these items, please contact the fire department through the borough building. Since it is a fairly small space, someone from the department will assess the donation to determine if it will be a good fit. Please do not drop off donations at the fire station. If you would like to help but don't have any of the mentioned items, cash donations are always welcome. The quarters also have quite a few cracked window panes. If you or someone you know is a contractor who would like to donate the time and material to fix the windows, that service would be greatly appreciated.

Once completed, the dayroom will be for the entire department's use. Ben envisions a place where members can watch DVDs on the big screen television, play games and use the internet. The volunteers of your local fire station are the first to respond when your life or your property are in danger. So far this year, the department has taken 80 calls. They expect to break 300 calls by the end of the year. If you would like to help protect your community, consider volunteering for the department. If you don't have the time to volunteer, donations of furniture, money or time will help those that are protecting you every day.







responded to and handled 938 calls for service in February 2010. There were 408 incidents reported, 165 complaints received and 24 accidents investigated, zero of which resulted in personal injury, and 24 resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 15 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, there was one for robbery, zero for motor vehicle theft, two for burglary, 10 for shoplifting, zero for aggravated assault and two other crimes.

There were four adult and one juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 33 traffic citations, 68 parking citations. Zero arrests for driving under the influence were made. There were three vandalism/criminal mischief complaint and zero narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to eight false alarm calls, took 88 reports, responded to wrote three non-traffic citations and responded to 16 calls for medical assistance.
