Even though this winter's snow is only a distant memory now that the leaves and flowers are unfurling, Edgewood's Public Works Department is still hard at work keeping the community clean and livable. In addition to the all important work of snow removal, the department is responsible for maintenance of the municipal buildings, property and vehicles, including the parks and sewers. They keep our streets drivable through repair, a yearly cleaning of the storm drains and street sweeping. They clean and repair borough property after storm damage. The department does all flower and tree planting for the borough. Members of the department also assist with community events like Community Day. It is the Public Works Department that picks up the borough's recycling every other week.

To help the department do all of this, the borough has five full time employees and hires three part-time workers in the summer. Major equipment includes a backhoe, two pick-up trucks, two two-ton and one five-ton dump trucks, a street sweeper, leaf loader, and a wood chipper.



## **EVFD**

At the time of writing this article the EVFD has answered 92 alarms as of April 15. I am proud to report that not one of these calls involved a fire in a structure in the borough. I am pleased to see that my article is read and that everyone is making their home fire safe. We even answered a call to the Borough of Homestead to stand by in their station due to the fact that they were tied up on a major fire. Edgewood was well protected due to mutual aid from surrounding departments. I accredit this to the fact that the word is out that EVFD is a well-trained aggressive department. We are now focusing on participating in the State Professional Certification Program. The purpose of this program is to identify and recognize emergency service personnel whose accomplishments in training and education meets or exceeds nationally recognized standards. We have many of the requirements now due to the members attaining certifications in Fire Fighter I, EMT and various rescue certifications.

Now that spring is here, it is time to remind you that it is not safe to store any gasoline or gasoline-fueled equipment in the basement. Although the furnace is off, the hot water heater is still on. The pilot light on the hot water heater will ignite gasoline vapors. Remember, it is the vapors that burn, not the gasoline. Store all gasoline powered equipment and their fuel outside in a safe and secure area. If you are storing them in the garage and the garage is attached to your house, be sure the integral door has a tight seal and it should be a solid wood 1 3/8" in thickness or a steel door.

As always, if you are interested in joining the EVFD, stop in for an application. Membership is open to anyone who is at least 14 years of age.

There were 408 incidents reported, 165 complaints received and 24 accidents investigated, zero of which resulted in personal injury, and 24 resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft and arson. Of the 15 Part I Crimes committed in the borough, there was one for robbery, zero for motor vehicle theft, two for burglary, 10 for shoplifting, zero for aggravated assault and two other crimes.

There were four adult and one juvenile arrests made for felony and misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 33 traffic citations, 68 parking citations. Zero arrests for driving under the influence were made. There were three vandalism/criminal mischief complaint and zero narcotics offenses.

Officers also responded to eight false alarm calls, took 88 reports, responded to wrote three non-traffic citations and responded to 16 calls for medical assistance


