seeds on the flower heads will help feed the birds through the hard days of winter. Foundation board member Kathy Clevenger, an organic flower gardener, worked closely with Patrick of Sistili's Nursery to select plants that will be a feeding habitat for the creatures mentioned above. Once established, the selected plants are drought tolerant, repeat bloomers, and they will feed the heart of our community with beauty.

The Foundation is currently working with the Borough of Edgewood and the Nine Mile Run Watershed Authority to keep the garden watered. Volunteers are needed to weed weekly. Call Kathy Clevenger at (412) 969-7519 if you are interested in spending an occasional hour to weed the area.

On June 16, 2010, during a luncheon celebration, the Pittsburgh History & Landmarks Foundation (PHLF) awarded scholarships to five high-achieving college-bound students who are involved in their communities and value Pittsburgh's history, architecture, and landscape design. PHLF received 47 applications this year and for the first time ever, awarded two scholarships to students from the same high school.

WHHS seniors, Victoria Lewis and Anna Murnane each will receive a scholarship for tuition and book expenses. The scholarships have a value of \$4,000 each and are made payable to the recipient's college/university over a four-year period.

The Woodland Hills High School Wolverine Football Team will be hosting a "Rally at the Wolvarena" in their home stadium in Turtle Creek on September 4, 2010.

The Rally will feature national marquee matches between the Wolverines and three other WPIAL teams playing against two powerhouse teams from Florida and two perennial top ranked schools from Ohio.

The schedule for the day-long event begins at 11:00 AM, when McKeesport plays Steubenville High School. At 2:00 PM, Central Catholic plays Akron Buchtel from Ohio. The third match-up of the day is Thomas Jefferson High School, the reigning state champion, against Cocoa, Florida.

Tickets for the event are \$18 and fans will be given wristbands that grant them in-and-out privileges for the day. Pre-sale tickets will be discounted.

Ken Halloy, president of Halloy Boy Sports Marketing in New Albany, Ohio is producing the event and credits Woodland Hills Head Coach George Novak with helping to make the "Rally" such a high caliber event.

With the support of Senator Jay Costa, Edgewood, along with Forest Hills. Churchill and Wilkins. was given the opportunity to participate in a free study to determine the feasibility of a regional police department in our area as noted in recent news articles. The Edgewood Police Department, led by Chief Payne, does an outstanding job and Council recently entered into a two-year contract extension with the officers. This study will assist Council in gathering information to determine what, if any, changes may be needed and is an important first step in directing the future of Edgewood's police services. The following information illustrates the escalating costs facing the Borough and its police force.

Currently, the Edgewood Police Department consists of the Chief. nine full-time police officers and several part-time officers. The fulltime officers through their collective bargaining agreement receive benefits that include health insurance. vision and dental insurance, life insurance, disability insurance, pension contributions and worker's compensation. In addition, the department also maintains 4 police cars and all the related communications and law enforcement equipment.

Raising taxes is not a solution, only a short term band-aid. A mill of tax increase (8.161 to 9.161) only increases revenue by \$189,850.30 based on current real estate assessments. Even with a tax : increase, the 2010 budget allocates no funds for infrastructure repair to streets, sidewalks or the Borough building nor improvement to any Borough facilities such as tennis courts or parks. As the information above shows, the current cost of a police force to patrol 8 miles of roads and 3,311 residents is becoming the single largest portion of the Borough's

The Edgewood Police Department responded to and handled 1,642 calls for service in June 2010. There were 552 incidents reported, 224 complaints received and 9 accidents investigated, 1 of which resulted in 1 personal injury, and 8 resulted in property damage.

Part I Crimes are the more serious crimes of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault. Burglary. Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson. Of the 16 Part I Crimes committed in the Borough, there were 0 for Robbery, 0 for Motor Vehicle Theft, 1 for Burglary, 10 for Shoplifting, 0 for Aggravated Assault and 5 Other Crimes. There were 6 adult and 0 juvenile arrests made for Felony and Misdemeanor violations.

Edgewood officers wrote a total of 91 Traffic Citations, 308 Parking Citations and 1 arrest for Driving Under the Influencewere made. There were 4 Vandalism/Criminal Mischief Complaints and 1 Narcotics Offense. Officers also responded to 21 False Alarm Calls, took 204 reports, responded to 4 Public Nuisance Complaints, wrote 6 Non-Traffic Citations and responded to 16 calls for Medical Assistance.
