Luminaria:


The EVFD will once again be selling luminaria. The kits will be \$10 and include 10 bags, 10 candles and a

Police Report

Sudden Cardiac Arrest Association

The Sudden Cardiac Arrest Association (SCAA) held their annual meeting in Pittsburgh this year from October 8 to 10 at the Pittsburgh Marriott City Center. The SCAA was founded and incorporated in 2005. It is a nonprofit, tax-exempt organization under the Internal Revenue Code. SCAA is an outgrowth of the pioneering work done by the National Center for Early Defibrillation (NCED), a unit of the Department of Emergency Medicine at the University of Pittsburgh. SCAA carries forward the original mission of NCED to broaden public access to early defibrillation. It has expanded its efforts to include public awareness of SCA, its prevention and treatment for those at risk and advocacy for a wide range of issues related to SCA

(see www.suddencardiacarrest.org).

On Friday, October 8, 2010, WTAE TV's Sally Wiggins hosted a cocktail reception honoring the survivors of sudden cardiac arrest and the rescuers who saved them. The SCA Survivors and Heroes Celebration reception was represented by people from your neighborhood. An elderly male Edgewood resident survived sudden cardiac arrest by the quick application of CPR and AED in August of 2008. He was able to attend the reception as a survivor. His rescuers included Edgewood resident Cynthia Boles, Edgewood Police Sergeant Susan Kaskie and Edgewood Patrol Officer Michael

Crow and Edgewood Volunteer Fire Assistant Chief Steve Halle, along with Eastern Area medics. The survivor and most of his rescuers were on hand to receive accolades and applause as they were awarded certificates from the SCAA.

Only six percent of the population who has a sudden cardiac arrest survives. There is an AED mounted in the Edgewood Borough Building. Edgewood Police vehicles are equipped with two AED's and the Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department now has an AED in all three of its fire vehicles. Your odds of being a survivor have improved!

Trash Talk Update

Edgewood Borough Council voted at the October 4, 2010 meeting to enter into a three year agreement with Waste Management to collect the Borough's trash and recyclables. You may recall an article in the October newsletter that explained upcoming changes in payment and recycling. The weekly pick up of garbage will not be changed. During 2011, trash will continue to be collected on Thursdays each week, other than in weeks with the following holidays: Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day. In those weeks, collection will be one day later (Friday).

On the recycling side, you will notice that the collection is now also being done by Waste Management. Recycling will continue to be collected every other week; however this year it will follow the same holiday schedule as the garbage collection. The same materials currently being collected will be picked up every other week.

The major change under the new contract is that property owners will now be billed directly from Waste Management on a quarterly basis. Look for the first bill to arrive late in the week of December 20, 2010. The quarterly bill for a single family residence will be \$40.65 (\$162.60 per year).






Scouts
