Get an Insider's View of the Copper Thefts **Edgewood Volunteer Fire** Department

EVFD will be holding a Citizen's Fire Academy. This is a free educational program that provides Edgewood residents with fire safety, rescue training and hands-on experience in emergency operations. In addition, you will gain firsthand knowledge of how the EVFD works.

Participants in this program will meet once or twice a week for several weeks. The program will include both classroom and practical outdoor sessions.

Topics included in this program are:

- Rope rescue
- Firefighting

Kindergarten Registration for the 2012 - 2013 School Year will be held from 12 - 7pm at the following locations:

Registration at the Academy does not insure future enrollment as that is determined by a lottery. The date for the Academy Lottery is Tuesday, May 1 at 6:30pm.

The central registration office at the administration building is closed. Please contact your local neighborhood school for registration hours and information. To register your child for transportation only, please contact (412)731-1300 ext. 0187. Kindergarten registration with kindergarten screenings are done in the spring at the elementary schools. Children must be 5 years of age by September 1st of the year they plan to start school.

There are a number of documents we will need to receive from you to establish residency within our District, as well as requirements for your child(ren) before entering school. They are highlighted below:

Notarized Affidavit of Residency.

Any one (1) of the following must be provided in addition to the above:

1. Valid PA Department of

Transportation: license or identification with current district address. 2. Valid PA automobile registration. 3. Current (within thirty (30) days) utility bills (gas, electric, cable, water) with district address.

4. Current tax statements with district address.

5. Current check stubs from wages with district address.

6. Copy of state/federal program enrollment.

7. Current credit card bill.

In addition, Parent/Guardian will also present the following for the child(ren): Child(ren)'s proofs:

1. Birth or baptismal certificate or current passport with child(ren)'s date of birth. Prior school record indicating date of birth.

2. Proof of immunization required by law – acceptable documentation includes:

a. Student's immunization record. b. Written statement from prior school district or a medical office that the required immunizations have been administered or that a required series is being administered.

c. Verbal assurances from prior school 1. Current deed or lease agreement or district or a medical office that required immunizations have been completed, with records to follow.

> 3. Notarized Affidavit of Guardianship, if applicable. (Sworn Statement of Resident in support of free school privileges for nonresident child)

> No child will be registered until residency can be proven. No child will be admitted to school without proof of immunizations. The above list of acceptable documents is subject to change at any time according to mandated requirements from the PA Department of Education.

> The school district reserves the right to request proof of residence of any resident with school age children at any time.

> They must have all updated shots, including Hepatitis B, two doses of MMR, and a dose of the varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. Please remember that Immunization records will be reviewed by the school nurse for required updates prior to child(ren) starting school.
