


# **Recognizing the Dedicated**

## **Energency Vehicle Driver** Training is a Long Process

Edgewood Volunteer Fire Department (EVFD) is staffed by 21 volunteers, 24 hours a day and has one emergency worker who is available service between 8am and 12am on weekdays. Borough staff member is This available to support the EVFD as a driver during the day. In the event of an emergency call during the day, the available emergency service worker responds with the appropriate truck and equipment, which is critical support to the department considering most volunteers work during the day. In order to assure the best possible response for our residents, volunteers respond to the station and ride the appropriate truck or respond to the location of the emergency.

Not all volunteers are trained to drive our engine or rescue vehicles; therefore, during the spring and summer months while there are more daylight hours, you will see our apparatus driving around the Edgewood Town Center or on neighborhood streets. We are currently training new drivers to be able to drive to emergencies. There are several phases of driver's training. First, the firefighter must take the Emergency Vehicle Driver Training class and be extremely knowledgeable on all of the equipment and how to run the pump. Next, the firefighter will begin the first phase of driving which is conducted in a controlled environment, like the Edgewood Town Center parking lot. After many hours, the next step is conducted on public highways, followed by a final driving test. This process takes anywhere from 60 to 80 hours of training. Part of our mission is to arrive safely to all emergency calls for our residents and surrounding areas.

EVFD's primary response area is mostly residential; however, EVFD responds to emergencies at businesses in Edgewood Town Centre and Regent Square, as well as, the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf and Edgewood Primary School In addition, EVFD is responsible for a portion of I-376 between the Squirrel Hill Tunnels and the Forest Hills/ Wilkinsburg exit with the assistance of the City of Pittsburgh. The Port Authority east bus way runs through Edgewood, as well as a main line of

## **Edgewood Police Capture** Murder Suspect

On March 26, 2012, the Edgewood Express was robbed at gun point. Edgewood Police were dispatched to the scene and received assistance from Wilkinsburg and Swissvale police departments.

The police forces worked together to apprehend the suspect. After a perimeter was set up and the suspect contained to a one block area a Police K-9 was used to apprehend the suspect.

Once in custody it was determined that the suspect was also wanted for a homicide in Erie, Pennsylvania, a robbery of the Sheetz in Wilkins Township and another robbery in Pittsburgh.

This information is being shared with Edgewood residents for safety reasons. These types of incidents are, fortunately, rare in our community however the possibility does exist.

Please remember to lock your doors, windows and vehicles. Our resident's safety is our number one concern.

The Edgewood police would like to thank the Wilkinsburg, Swissvale, Rankin and Braddock Hills Police Departments for the excellent assistance provided in the capture of the suspect.



# Lane Closures in Squirrel Hill Tunnels

Westbound lane closures in the Squirrel Hill Tunnels have begun.


The \$49.5 million rehabilitation of the Squirrel Hill Tunnels will cause lane closures starting in March, PennDOT has announced. One westbound (inbound) lane will close at 10pm Mondays through Saturdays for the foreseeable future. Lanes will reopen by 5am, Tuesdays through Fridays and 10am, Saturdays and Sundays.

There will not be any overnight work into Monday. Full weekend closures of the westbound tunnel are scheduled to begin in late July. No restrictions are planned for the eastbound tunnel this season.
