#### How much does Edgewood recycle?

In 2011, Edgewood residents recycled 179 tons of paper, plastic, cans, and glass. In 2012, residents recycled 231 tons. We showed an improvement of 52 tons in one year!

#### What caused our residential recycling increase?

Much of that 52 ton improvement was due to the increase in paper collection at the bins behind the municipal building on Race Street, which had an increase in collection of 47 tons of paper. Please continue to recycle your magazines, newspapers, junk mail, and other discarded paper in the bins in back of the municipal building, 2 Race Street.

#### What about our businesses?

Edgewood businesses have changed hands over the past few years, so the recycling materials that are generated have changed. This fact makes it a little hard to compare years. However, Edgewood's commercial districts recycled 359 tons of material in 2011, and 384 tons in 2012. Way to go Edgewood businesses!

#### What caused our commercial recycling increase?

This question is a little harder to answer, again due to changing businesses operating in Edgewood. But we did see an almost 5 ton increase in the plastic bags recycled outside Giant Eagle, and a 17 ton increase in corrugated cardboard collected from Giant Eagle. Good job, Giant Eagle!

Who checks their smoke and carbon monoxide alarms and furnaces. And reminds others to do the same.

Who gives gifts of time and talents to their neighborhood and lets those who do know their efforts are appreciated.

Each driver with a vehicle registered in the Borough is able to purchase a Residential on-street parking pass. A Visitor's pass may also be purchased. Visitor passes may not be used on any vehicle registered within the Borough. The fees for on-street parking permits, as well as Borough off-street lots and recreational/commercial vehicles, are listed below. Permits for 2014 will be available at the Borough Building beginning December 2. 2013.

Applications for the Borough's off-street parking lots will be accepted starting on December 2, 2013. On December 16, 2013, permits will be issued based upon requests. If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces, a lottery will be held. No resident will be issued a second permit until all initial requests are processed.

The Edgewood Borough Real Estate Tax, which was mailed out in April, will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector around December 15. I mailed a payment reminder in October for those who had yet to pay. Once the list is turned over to the delinguent tax collector, additional fees are added on to the total due, so please pay before December 15.

The Woodland Hills School District Real Estate Tax is now due at penalty, unless you are paying in installments. If you are paying in installments, the third installment is due by February 28, 2014.

# The Regent Square Theatre

daewood Borough is proud to be the home of the unique Re-Jugent Square Theater since it was built in 1938. The building on S. Braddock Avenue has always functioned as a film theater, but when it was purchased by Pittsburgh Filmmakers in 1999, it took on a whole new life. Pittsburgh Filmmakers is a non-profit media arts organization that promotes photography and film arts. The Regent Square Theater



and its sister theaters, the Melrose Screening Room and the Harris Theater, promote the nonprofit's mission by showing independent American films and first-run foreign films. Ninety-nine percent of what is screened at the Regent Square Theater is not available in commercial multiplex theaters. The Theater allows Edgewood residents to access whole genres and films otherwise not available in the region.


Many residents enjoy the Theater's "Sunday Night Classics," which showcase guintessential films with cinematic

#### PARKING PERMITS

It is that time of year to purchase your 2014 on-street and visitor Parking Permits. If you purchase an on-street parking permit, the correct place to adhere the permit

is your back window, driver's side, lower corner. In the past, Officers have written unnecessary parking tickets due to incorrect permit placement on side windows, bumpers, windshields, etc. Please help us prevent the inconvenience of getting a parking ticket despite having a valid permit. Place the onstreet parking permit in the back window, driver's side, outer bottom corner.

Regarding the visitor's parking pass, please hang it from your rear-view mirror when in use. Officers have noticed that some visitors just lay the pass on the dash board. Please understand that once we write the parking ticket, we cannot void it. We will place the ticket on the windshield, and the vehicle owner will have to make a special trip to the Borough building regarding the ticket. Remember, Officers enforce the Borough no-parking ordinance from 3am-5am, when it is very dark. Please ask yourself: Will they be able to see my permit? Officers can see the permits only where they are

properly placed.






#### BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE Wednesday, December 18 at 7pm


