

Edgewood Recycles

Edgewood recycles plastics #1-7.

What do these different numbers mean?

The recycle numbers stand for different types of plastics. In the recycling plant, automatic sorters use near infrared (NIR) technology to identify and sort the plastics into seven separate categories (see chart below). The plastics are shredded, impurities such as paper labels are eliminated, and the plastics are melted down into pellets, which are then sent on for recycling.

Recycle Code	Plastic Polymer	Common Objects Made from this Plastic	Recycled into:
01 PET	Polyethylene terephthalate (PET, PETE)	Soda, water and salad dressing bottles; peanut butter jars, jelly jars; small electronics.	Fabrics for outerwear (polar fleece), shoes; bottles, jars, strapping tape, carpet.
02 PE-HD	High-density polyethylene (HDPE)	Giant Eagle bags, milk, juice and water jugs, hula hoops, 5-gallon buckets, some shampoo & toiletry bottles.	Plastic lumber, benches, fences, doghouses; plastic rulers, trash containers
03 PVC	Polyvinyl chloride (PVC)	Window cleaner & detergent bottles, syrup bottles, electrical cable insulation, vinyl records.	PVC hoses, decks, paneling, mud flaps, traffic cones, PVC pipe
04 PE-LD	Low-density polyethylene (LDPE)	Frozen food bags; squeezable bottles (honey, mustard); cling films; flexible container lids.	Garbage can liners, plastic lumber, trash cans, plastic furniture, shipping envelopes
05 PP	Polypropylene (PP)	Reusable microwaveable dishes; kitchenware; yogurt containers; margarine tubs; disposable cups; plates.	Buckets, paint pails, car bumpers, car battery cases, furniture and flower pots.
06 PS	Polystyrene (PS)	Egg cartons; packing peanuts; disposable cups, plates, trays and cutlery; take-out containers.	Hangers, flower pots, toys, picture frames; polystyrene insulation.
07 O	Other	3 and 5-gallon bottles, baby milk bottles, compact discs, DVD cases, sunglasses, police riot shields	Plastic lumber, custom-made products, varies widely.



Here at the EVFD, many of our members once found themselves staring up at a big red firetruck in awe, wanting nothing more than to be a firefighter. We love giving tours to anyone, whether a prospective firefighter or your 3 year old child, it is a good time for everyone! We are also available for birthday parties—just contact the fire station!



Safety Inspections

The EVFD has developed a program that will help to ensure the safety of the residents of Edgwood. If requested, a member of the EVFD will come to your place of residency or business and, through a strict program developed by our certified Fire Inspectors, inspect your house for the functionality of your smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, extinguishers, and other life safety devices. The firefighter will also evaluate any unsafe conditions, such as overloaded outlets, crowded space heaters, or outdoor grills and firepits. In addition, the firefighter will record specific pertinent data, such as utility shut off locations and the nearest fire hydrant, as well as dangers, such as hidden basements and construction hazards.

Group Education

We are happy to provide basic first aid training and fire safety education to residents of all ages. Whether a pack of cub scouts or a class of school children, our firefighters are happy to come to you and present on the basics of fire safety and/or first aid. EDGEWOOD HISTORICAL SOCIETY


Since the last issue of the newsletter, several new members have joined the Society. WELCOME!



Happy Birthday C.C. Mellor Library and Edgewood Community House

C.C. Mellor Memorial Library opened its doors on August 8, 1918. That opening day was the result of many years of work by a large number of individuals. Primary among them was Alvin Spindler, an Edgewood resident who made money in oil and later practiced law. Mr. Spindler conceived what he called the "Edgewood Idea;" the construction of one building to house a club for recreation, socializing, and education, as well as a public library. He pitched his idea without success in the early 1900s. A decade later, conditions were more favorable for community acceptance. This "Idea" evolved into what is now the C.C. Mellor Memorial Library and Edgewood Community House.

The Edgewood Club was formed in 1904. Its first building was a frame home on Maple Avenue. Members modified the structure to include bowling alleys, billiard and card rooms, and a ballroom with stage. Edgewood was growing and more space was needed to educate its young people. The Club was approached by school leaders to sell their building so that a high school could be built. They sold the land to the school for \$27,000. Originally the Club directors had planned to purchase the property next door on Maple Avenue for the new building. However they soon realized that the site would not be adequate for the building and looked for a new site. They settled on the club and library's current location, which was purchased from the family of Charles Chauncey Mellor at a reduced rate.

A community meeting was held on May 8, 1914 to discuss this new building for Edgewood. It was widely stated by meeting organizers that this building would be the first of its type in the United States to house both a library and a club. Those present approved of the idea and set about raising funds. Only six weeks were allotted to raise funds for the library portion of the building; that deadline was extended several times as community members felt a library was important. Funds for the new building came from the sale of the property on Maple Avenue as well as donations from members and residents of Edgewood and Wilksburg.

The original idea was for a building that would cost \$25,000 with space shared equally between the Library and the Club. The Edgewood Club Building Committee approached the Carnegie Foundation for a \$12,500 contribution in memory of C.C. Mellor, who was a boyhood friend of Andrew Carnegie. Mr. Carnegie was in Scotland and wrote back on the original letter in the margin "I think this O.K." As plans progressed, the anticipated costs for the building rose to over \$80,000. The committee again approached Mr. Carnegie for an increase to \$40,000. His response was "I think we have gone far enough. A.C."

Construction of the building began in 1915. The Club began using their portion of the building in 1916. The Library opened in 1918.



The 2014 Edgewood Borough Real Estate Tax which was mailed out April 1 is now due at penalty. If you did not receive your bill, call my office at 412-731-0200.

The 2014 Woodland Hills School Tax was mailed out July 1 and is due at discount until August 31. My office will be closed the week of August 18-22 and will reopen on the 25th. That week, I will be in the office Monday thru Friday from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Because the 31st is on Sunday and Monday is Labor Day, I will accept taxes at discount on Tuesday and Wednesday, September 2 and 3, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m.

Please remember that if you are paying in installments, you will only get a receipt with your final payment if you include a self-addressed, stamped envelope. If you need a receipt for your taxes next year, you will also need to include a SASE or there will be a \$5 fee.
