DO NOT INCLUDE: Food waste, plastic bags, or polystyrene foam cups & containers

Paper and cardboard must be dry and free of food debris.

Paper food containers must be rinsed out, no caps.

Tissues, paper towels or other paper that has been in contact with food is not acceptable.

Make sure food contamination and caps are removed from cans and plastics and all containers are empty.

Separate plastic lids from plastic bottles (often made from different materials)

Keep medical waste (syringes, needles) out of recycling containers or place in safe disposal containers like Waste Management's MedWaste Tracker® box.



NEW HIRES

The Edgewood Police Department would like to welcome Chris Lewandowski and Ken Sebastian. Officer Lewandowski and Officer Sebastian are recent graduates from the police academy, and are our newest part time police officers.

Officer Lewandowski grew up in the area and is familiar with our great reputation, as well as the challenges we face. Officer Lewandowski rode with an officer on all shifts, as well as riding with a field training officer for several months. He is now on his own, keeping our streets safe.

Officer Sebastian is the department's most recent hire. He received valuable experience as an officer in Upper Burrell Police Department. Officer Sebastian is also an active firefighter in his hometown.

JUST A REMINDER

Our night turn officers are tasked with the duty of keeping the streets safe while everyone sleeps. One of the duties is to enforce the Borough ordinance for 3-5 a.m. parking. This task can be very daunting, due to weather, vehicle's window tint, placement of the parking permit, and the obvious,...it's VERY DARK.

There are several ways to ensure that you don't get a parking ticket. All vehicles that are parked on the street between 3am and 5am must have a valid on street parking pass, or a visitors pass. Recreational vehicles, moving trucks, and trailers are NOT permitted to be parked on the street from midnight-6 a.m.

Visitor's passes should always <u>hang from the rear view mirror</u>. If the officer does not see an **on-street parking permit on the rear window**, and does not see a **visitors pass on the rear view mirror**, he or she will write a parking ticket. **When the officer places the parking ticket under the wiper, and then observes a visitor's pass lying on the dashboard, it's too late**. Only the Chief of Police can void the parking ticket once the officer has written it.

Please remove ALL expired parking permits from your windows. Not only does this make it more difficult for the officer, who might mistakenly write you a parking ticket, too many stickers on the rear window could block your visibility.

The Borough of Edgewood does NOT take requests for on street parking. You can no longer call and ask for permission to park a friends/relatives vehicle for one night. The Police Chief or the Borough Manager can grant exceptions for specific reasons, (driveway work, family emergencies, etc.).


If you ever have any questions, please call the Borough, or flag down an officer. If you have an emergency, remember, you MUST call 911. We are always happy to help in any way that we can.

Edgewood Historical Society News

The society received two wonderful donations in 2015. Mr. Thomas Reichner of Allenby Avenue donated a wonderful sign that he found in his home. It is thought to have belonged to a former owner and teacher at the Edgewood Middle school Mr.

Alan Popsack. The sign reads, "HALL OF FAME E.M.S." If anyone has any remembrances or information on this sign please email us! We would like to be able to put a story with it. Also, Mr. David Lerberg, (former resident of 424 Maple Avenue from 1976 to 1995), donated some great materials he found in a safe at 424 Maple Avenue The materials date from 1813 into the early 1900s. It details the history of the William Miller family who were early east end pioneer settlers that owned a supply-trading company in old Port Perry. They supplied lumber and other materials floated on barges to build early Pittsburgh. Mr. Miller's son,

John Miller built and lived with his family at Maple Avenue for most of his life. He was an early member of the Edgewood Presbyterian Church. He was great friends with both George and Herman Westinghouse. He worked in many different positions for the Westinghouse Companies. He was the first president of the Turtle Creek Valley Water Co. and also the first president of Westinghouse Home Building Company which later became the East Pittsburgh Improvement Company. This company developed communities and built most of the homes in Wilmerding, East Pittsburgh, Turtle Creek, Trafford, East Mckeesport, old Patton Township, and Forest Hills. It is thought that he had a hand in building some of the larger homes in Edgewood. In his last role he served as President and Chairman of the Board of the Westinghouse Airbrake Company in 1916. This material is available to residents and researchers. Please look for some of the above items in the newly revamped history display cases on the second floor of C.C. Mellor Library



MOVE UP PROJECT: Autumn 2015

CCM will be a site of a free innovative weight management study offered by the University of Pittsburgh's Graduate School of Public Health. The Move Up Project is open to men and women ages 60-75. Participants must have a BMI between 27-48, be able to walk without assistive devices, have a medical release from their doctor, not been hospitalized overnight in the past six months, and not actively receiving treatment for cancer.

During this 13 month program participants will attend meetings with topics on diet/nutrition, exercise, overcoming barriers, goal setting and relapse prevention. Additionally, as a study participant you will receive up to five physical functioning assessments. All of this is free. You can sign up at the Library or get more information by calling Lori Kleffer at 412-383-1301. We do not have set dates yet, as there is a minimum of 10 participants at our site for the program.

Financial Planning Workshop

The Library will kick off a series of financial planning workshops on Wednesday September 30 at 6:30 p.m. in the Library Board Room. Led by Jeff Elms from Edward Jones, the first topic will be Foundations of Investing. This presentation will discuss the importance of developing an investment strategy, the impact of asset allocation, and the influence of inflation on your long-term goals. For a limited time only, Allegheny County will be accepting applications to acquire vacant properties in 39 municipalities at reduced cost to the applicant. The purpose of the Allegheny County Vacant Property Recovery Program (AVPRP) is to acquire blighted, tax delinquent properties and resell them to applicants for a reuse outlined in their application and approved by the municipality.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES:

- This limited-time program will be available in Baldwin Borough, Braddock Hills, Carnegie, Collier, Crafton, Dravosburg, East Deer, East McKeesport, Edgewood, Elizabeth Township, Forward, Green Tree, Harrison, Heidelberg, Liberty, McCandless, Millvale, Moon, Munhall, Neville, North Fayette, North Versailles, Oakdale, O'Hara, Penn Hills, Plum, Ross, Scott, South Versailles, Swissvale, Turtle Creek, Versailles, West Deer, West Homestead, West Mifflin, West View, Whitaker, White Oak, and Wilkins. Other municipalities that join AVPRP may be eligible to participate depending upon the timing.
- Applications must be submitted no later than **August 31, 2015**. Up to sixty applications will be accepted in the order in which they are received. No more than five applications will be accepted per municipality.
- Each participating municipality must submit evidence of a program marketing strategy to ensure that all residents have an equal opportunity to apply.
