

2025 Parking Permits

Resident on-street and visitor on-street parking permits go on sale Monday, December 2, 2024. Permits can be purchased online at http://www.edgewood.pgh.pa.us/edgewood-parkingpermits. Permits will be mailed to purchasers thereby eliminating the need to appear in person to buy a permit at the borough building. On-street resident and visitor permits cost \$35 each. Off-street borough parking lot permits cost \$100.

Permits for the Ivy Street, Laurel Street, Elm Street, Oakview Avenue, and Willow Place off-street parking lots will be made available for purchase based upon requests starting on Monday December 9, 2024. Residents interested in purchasing an off-street lot permit should submit their completed permit application to the borough on or before Monday December 9, 2024. If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces, a lottery will be held. No resident will be issued a second permit for a lot until all initial requests are processed.

Body Worn Camera Replacement Grant

The Edgewood Borough Police Department received a \$30,000 grant from Allegheny County to replace their existing body worn cameras purchased in 2021. Funding was made available through the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund and county council member Sam DeMarco. The Edgewood Borough Police Department has utilized body worn cameras since 2021. Under the department's policy, every officer is assigned a camera to be worn throughout their shift and they are to be used in accordance with state law.

Change in Garbage Collector

Beginning January 1, 2025 the borough will be served by Big's Sanitation. Billing will be performed by Jordan Tax Service on behalf of the borough and collector. Residents can continue using their existing cans and containers when placing their trash at the curb. Collection service remains unchanged with trash collected every week and recycling every other week but a collection day has not yet been finalized as of this writing. A glass recycling dumpster will be available in the borough's rear parking lot and residents can still arrange for e-waste and household hazardous waste pickup. Please watch your mail for information coming directly from Big's Sanitation on a collection day and other collection rules.

Voting Information—Change to polling location

Please be sure to familiarize yourself with the voting location change affecting many Edgewood residents. We published information in the September/October newsletter that voting would occur at the Edgewood Elementary School. Unfortunately, since that information was published the school has started renovations and cannot accommodate election goers. Therefore, the Allegheny County Department of Elections moved polling operations to the First Presbyterian Church of Edgewood located at 120 E. Swissvale Avenue. All voters who used to vote at Edgewood Elementary should vote at the First Presbyterian Church for the November 5, 2024 general election. Questions about voting in general should be directed to the Allegheny County Department of Elections by calling 412-350-4500. Edgewood Borough respectfully cannot answer questions about voting matters.

Grant Funding Announcement

Thanks to Senator Jay Costa and Representative Abigail Salisbury for securing a \$425,000 grant for physical improvements to the Edgewood municipal building complex. The funds will be used to resurface the parking lot, improve pedestrian access and signage and improve storm water management. Design work will commence in early 2025 with construction to start tentatively late 2025 or early 2026.

Leaf Collection

Annual leaf collection starts Monday October 28, 2024. Residents must not place leaves at the curb until this time. Leaves left at the curb for an extended period of time are very difficult to vacuum and slow down the collection process since they soak up water and become compacted from vehicle traffic. Help our public works department by keeping your leaves in your yard until the day before they're scheduled for collection. Doing so ensures that everyone's leaves are collected in a timely manner. Thursday is a catch up day. Public works uses this day to go back over any streets needing extra cleaning or that they couldn't complete earlier in the week.

Property owners that routinely place piles of leaves in the street days before their scheduled collection day may be subject to enforcement action for creating an unsafe condition. Collection delays and cancellations will be posted on the borough marquis, phone system and our Facebook page and website.

Collection is weather dependent. Heavy rain or snow weighs down the leaves making them harder to vacuum. Additional time can be required if we experience several consecutive days of bad weather. Crews strive to collect each street on the posted day but that is not always possible.

As of October, here's how our year is shaping up:

- 564 calls so far this year
- 53 calls in September
- Averaging 1.86 calls per day
- Projected to hit 679 calls by year-end
- 5.5 members respond per call, with 4.2 members on an apparatus

What inspired you to become a fire-fighter? "It wasn't really on my radar until the morning of June 27, 2022, when my neighbor's house caught fire. I witnessed the swift response of the EVFD and immediately wanted to get involved."

A memorable call or experience? "Every call has an impact, but recently I helped deliver a baby in traffic on 376—it was a beautiful moment I'll never forget."

What do you enjoy most about serving the community? "Getting to know Edgewood and engaging with residents while giving back is a huge part of why I joined."

Something surprising about you? "I'm not a full-time firefighter. I work a 9-5 like most of our members."

Advice for those considering joining? "If you're interested, dive in. It's not easy, but it's incredibly rewarding. We provide comfort in people's worst moments, and that's what the EVFD is all about."

Ways to keep your home safe this winter

As the colder months approach and furnaces are switched on, we want to remind everyone about the potential dangers of carbon monoxide (CO) and the importance of having working CO detectors in your home. Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that can be deadly. To ensure your safety, please take the following precautions:

- **1. Install and maintain CO detectors** on each level of your home, particularly near sleeping areas.
- **2. Test your CO detectors regularly** to confirm they are working properly. If the alarm sounds, do not ignore it—call 911 immediately.
- **3. Be aware of CO poisoning symptoms**, which include headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain, and confusion. Exposure can be fatal, so please take any warning signs seriously.
- **4. Schedule an annual furnace check** with a qualified specialist to ensure it's functioning safely and efficiently.

Soup with St. Nick



Robotics Program and Competition

The Woodland Hills School District has partnered with multiple school districts in Western Pennsylvania as well as Special Olympics Pennsylvania to develop a unified robotics program and competition. On Wednesday, September 18, educators from those school districts met at Woodland Hills High School for a day of professional development that focused on how to build and develop the programs in each of their school districts.



The unified robotics program pairs neurotypical and neurodiverse students in a competitive yet collaborative environment, all while developing their skills as communicators, engineers, problem solvers, and more. Each team features a mix of regular education and special education students as they work together to score as many points as they can on VEX Robotics' VEX IQ Competition Rapid Relay field. Woodland Hills has partnered with VEX Robotics over the past three years to integrate a K-12 robotics curriculum into the district and to launch after-school clubs like the middle school competitive robotics team at Dickson Preparatory STEAM Academy, the Mother-Daughter Robotics Club at Rankin Community Center, and a VEX IQ elementary competitive robotics team that is new this school year.

The goal is to provide an environment that promotes respect, empathy, and collaboration between students with and without special needs, all while fostering a fun and competitive atmosphere. All students are welcome, and no experience is necessary to be part of the program. The September training introduced other districts to the robotics kits and the process of forming a team. The schools will meet on December 13 for a friendly competition.

Woodland Hills Renovations Update

Renovations are ongoing at Edgewood Elementary STEAM Academy. The Woodland Hills School District is in the midst of Phase One of the project, which is focused on the exterior of the building. Phase One includes the installation of a security vestibule at the main entrance of the building, which will increase the safety and security of students and staff; the construction of a bus turn-around on Maple Avenue to enhance student and pedestrian safety and improve traffic congestion during arrival and dismissal; repairs to the brick and underlying support structure on the exterior of the building; repairs to the roof; and replacement of windows. The district is also installing a new HVAC system throughout the building.

Phase Two of the renovations would focus on the interior of the building and will be discussed at future district board meetings. The district appreciates the patience and understanding of families, students, staff, and the community during the renovation process, which is expected to continue throughout the school year.
