ARTICLE I
General Provisions

§ 193-1. Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, except for sections or articles to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq. (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81), as amended, except that in this chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
- B. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.
- C. Definitions. As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

LEGAL HOLIDAYS — Means and includes New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

BOROUGH — The Borough of Edgewood.

§ 193-2. Temporary and emergency regulations.

- A. The Chief of Police shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
- (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
 - (2) In the case of emergency public works or public events of limited scope or duration, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
- B. These temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the police and other enforcement personnel in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who drives or parks a vehicle in violation of any such regulation or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.

§ 193-3. Experimental regulations.

- A. The Borough Council may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the streets and alleys in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate those locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall drive or park a vehicle in violation of any such regulation,

prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty set out in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.

- B. The purpose of this section is to allow for test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough relative to traffic and parking.

§ 193-4. Streets closed or restricted for construction, maintenance or special events.

- A. The Chief of Police shall have authority to close any street or alley or specific part of a street or alley to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
- B. The Chief of Police shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street or alley where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

§ 193-5. Authority of police officers.

The police shall have authority to direct traffic on the streets and alleys in the Borough, at intersections in public and in other places where the Vehicle Code or this chapter applies.

ARTICLE II Traffic Regulations

§ 193-6. Speed limits; penalties.

- A. Violations and penalties. All moving violations are charged under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.
- B. Borough-wide speed limit. The speed limit for both directions of traffic along all streets and alleys, or parts thereof, in the Borough of Edgewood is hereby established at 25 miles per hour, except for those speed limits regulated under Subsection C below. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that street or alley or part thereof.
- C. Exceptions. The speed limit for both directions of traffic along the streets and alleys or parts thereof described below is hereby established at the rate of speed indicated in said schedule. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that street or alley or part thereof.

§ 193-7. Traffic control signals and devices.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated at the intersection of those streets and alleys described below.

§ 193-8. Prohibited right turns on red signal.

No person shall make a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street or alley into another one-way street or alley) when facing a steady red signal at any of the locations described below.

§ 193-9. Prohibited turns at intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the intersections described below.

§ 193-10. Required turns at intersections at certain times.

When traveling on the streets and alleys indicated below, during the times and in the direction indicated, all vehicles at the following intersections shall be required to turn as directed onto the intersecting street and proceed along that street. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to not make the required turn required as set forth below.

§ 193-11. U-turns.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a U-turn on any of the streets or alleys or parts thereof described below.

§ 193-12. One-way streets.

The streets and alleys or parts of streets and alleys described below are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street or alley.

§ 193-13. No-passing zones.

No-passing zones are hereby established along those streets or parts of streets described below, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no-passing zone described in said schedule.

§ 193-14. Stop intersections.

The intersections described below are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected in such a position upon the first-named street or alley as to face traffic approaching the second-named street or alley in the direction or directions indicated in said schedule. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street or alley, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop before entering any such intersection.

§ 193-15. Yield intersections.

The intersections described below are hereby established as yield intersections, and official yield signs shall be erected in such a position upon the first-named street or alley as to face traffic approaching the second-named street or alley in the direction or directions indicated. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street or alley, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall slow down or stop the vehicle and then yield the right-of-way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on the second-named street or alley so closely as to constitute a hazard during the time that the driver is moving across or within such intersection.

§ 193-16. Closing of certain streets to certain vehicles.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any vehicle, except a passenger vehicle (but not including any passenger vehicle drawing any trailer or towing any other vehicle), upon any of the streets or parts of streets described below.

§ 193-17. Vehicle weight limits; penalties.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any commercial vehicle or other tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, road-building and maintenance equipment or equipment used in construction having a gross weight in excess of 8,000 pounds upon any of the streets, alleys or bridges, or portions thereof, in the Borough of Edgewood, except for the purpose of making local deliveries on said streets or alleys.

B. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

LOCAL DELIVERY — Includes and means a delivery by a van or commercial vehicle to a residence or club or other existing structure for use in and by the residents, occupants or owners of the residence, club or existing structure, and shall include motor vehicles and equipment engaged in repair and/or maintenance of residences, clubs or other structures within the Borough.

C. Any person violating any of the provisions of the vehicle weight limit regulations of the Borough shall, for each and every such violation, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of the fine and costs shall be sentenced to a term of imprisonment in the county prison for not more than 10 days.

ARTICLE III
On-Street Parking Regulations

§ 193-18. Vehicles to be parked within marked spaces.

Wherever a space is marked off on any street or alley for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this article for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.

§ 193-19. Parking without lights.

The boundary limits of the Borough of Edgewood are hereby established as a zone in which motor vehicles may remain standing without lights, and all streets and alleys within such boundary limits are hereby designated as streets where motor vehicles may remain standing without lights.

§ 193-20. Overnight parking of commercial and large vehicles.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain, on any street or alley in the Borough, at any time between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. any of the following:

- (1) Any commercial motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, tractor or truck-tractor, except that any of the same may be parked during such period for such reasonable period as may be required for the prompt loading or unloading thereof or for the rendering of public utility service or other service of an emergency nature.
 - (2) Any travel trailer, camper, motor home or housecar, whether or not equipped and fitted with living and/or sleeping accommodations.
- B. Any vehicle registered "truck" but used solely for pleasure (not for business) may obtain a permit issued by the Borough Manager granting the privilege of parking on any street or alley in the Borough, where properly designated, between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m.

§ 193-21. Parking on or near bridges prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle, or to allow the same to remain parked, on any bridge in the Borough of Edgewood or at any point within 50 feet of either end of any bridge.

§ 193-22. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or alleys or parts thereof described below, except at the angle designated and only within the painted stall lines. On all streets or alleys or portions thereof where angle parking is now or shall hereafter be authorized, all vehicles parked thereon shall be parked with the front thereof nearest the curb.

- A. No person shall park a vehicle at any time between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on any street in the Borough, except those locations set forth in Subsection B hereof.

§ 193-29. Penalties for parking violations.

§ 193-30. Designation of spaces.⁴

The Edgewood Borough Council shall by a proper ordinance duly passed at a duly constituted Council meeting designate a particular handicapped parking space on any street or thoroughfare in the Borough of Edgewood, which shall be marked as a handicapped parking space and used as a handicapped parking space.

§ 193-31. Issuance of permit.

Handicapped parking spaces shall be permitted upon issuance of a permit by the police of the

Borough of Edgewood for a period of one year, and upon the expiration of one year shall be resubmitted and reevaluated by the Council of the Borough of Edgewood for approval for an additional year, with the process to continue from year to year until the handicapped need is removed or the premises is sold.

§ 193-32. Removal of permit and signs.

In the event that there is no longer a need for a handicapped space or in the event that the property has been sold, the handicapped parking permit shall be removed and all signs indicating such space shall be removed.

§ 193-33. Penalties for handicapped parking violations.

Any person who shall violate any provisions of this section by parking in said handicapped space without proper handicapped identification shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$200 by this section, or such fines and penalties as determined through the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.), and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than five days.

**Article V
Borough Parking Lots**

§ 193-34. Permit required; fee.

- A. No person shall park a motor vehicle in a Borough of Edgewood parking lot unless he has first obtained, and maintained in effect, a permit for the same from the Borough Manager.
- B. Furthermore, no person shall apply for a parking permit or renew said permit for a parking place in a Borough of Edgewood parking lot unless said vehicle is currently registered and inspected, or, if registered out of state, as deemed road-worthy by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.
- C. The fee for said permit shall be as established in Chapter 118, Fees.

§ 193-35. Parking regulations.

No person shall park a motor vehicle in Borough parking lot except in the space allotted for the same by the permit granted therefor, and each person holding such a permit shall comply

with the rules, regulations and provisions established by the Borough of Edgewood with respect to the use of the Borough parking lots.

§ 193-36. Parking lot penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this article shall, for every such violation, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$25, and costs of prosecution; provided, however, that each day's violation of any of the provisions of this article shall constitute a separate violation.

ARTICLE VI
Parking Permits
[Amended 10-4-2010 by Ord. No. 1033]

§ 193-37. Definitions.

For the purpose of this article, certain words and terms are defined as herein indicated:

ADMINISTRATOR — The Borough Manager of the Borough of Edgewood.

AUTOMOBILE — Passenger vehicle as defined in Section 102 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code Title 75.³

COMMERCIAL VEHICLE — Any motor vehicle registered by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as a commercial vehicle and requiring a commercial driver's license to operate. Types of commercial vehicles include, but are not limited to, the following types of vehicles: trailers, trucks, or other wheeled vehicles used primarily in the furtherance of a business enterprise. This shall apply to any commercial vehicle larger than 7 feet x 15 feet, but not to exceed 10 feet x 20 feet.

COMPANY AUTOMOBILE — Passenger vehicle as defined in Section 103 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code Title 75, used in conjunction with the respective applicant's employer.

HOUSEHOLD — Single-family dwelling, townhouse, duplex, individual apartment, individual condominium, and any other residence that requires a separate mailing address.

IMMEDIATE FAMILY — Immediate family consists of the resident's spouse, children, mother, father, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, grandfather or grandmother.

MOTORCYCLE — A motor vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground.

MOTOR-DRIVEN CYCLE — A motorcycle, including a motor scooter, with a motor not to exceed five brake horsepower.

NONRESIDENT — A licensed driver who does not reside in the Borough of Edgewood and

who has an inspected, insured and operable vehicle registered in his or her own name.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES — Any camper, trailer, boat or other wheeled vehicle designed to be drawn by passenger automobile, or other vehicle, and not primarily designed for day-to-day passenger transport over the roadways. This shall apply to any such recreational vehicle larger than 7 feet x 15 feet, but not to exceed 10 feet x 20 feet.

REGISTERED VEHICLE — A vehicle with a current vehicle registration in accordance with the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code, Title 75, Pa.C.S.A.⁴

RELATIVE — Immediate family member as defined herein, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, uncle, aunt, first cousin, stepfather, stepmother, stepbrother, stepsister, stepson or stepdaughter.

RESIDENT — A licensed driver who resides in the Borough of Edgewood and who has an inspected, insured and operable automobile, motorcycle, or motor-driven cycle currently registered in their own name or in the name of a relative residing at the same address.

RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT — Duly authorized permit from the Borough of Edgewood issued by the administrator, or his or her designee, to a permit holder allowing on-street parking between 3:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.

§ 193-38. Permit requirements.

A. Resident.

- (1) Proof of residency which shall include any two of the following and bearing a Borough of Edgewood address: Tax receipts, utility bill, property closing statement, driver's license, bank statement, lease, vehicle registration, or deed.
- (2) Verification of car ownership and/or specific written permission to operate a company automobile.
- (3) Payment of the permit fee in full.
- (4) Proof of current registration.
- (5) Proof of current insurance.
- (6) Proof of valid driver's license.

B. One visitor permit may be purchased at the resident parking fee rate and will be issued to the resident for his/her visitors.

C. The visitor permits are hanging placards which shall be placed on the inside rear-view mirror and are reusable all year long.

D. Caregiver.

- (1) Residents, or nonresidents who have dependents living in the Borough, requiring the services of a caregiver (i.e., hospice, home health services, senior care, nanny/childcare) during the 3:00 a.m. – 5:00 a.m. parking permitted period may apply for a "visitor" permit.

- (2) One such permit may be purchased at the resident parking fee rate and will be issued for one year to the resident as a “visitor.”
- (3) The Borough resident must provide proof of residency.

§ 193-39. Permit exception.

A. Overnight guests.

- (1) Households will be allowed on-street parking, for a guest for parking between 3:00 am. and 5:00 a.m., with a visitor’s permit.

B. Company automobile.

- (1) Where a resident utilizes a company automobile and wishes to apply for an on-street parking permit for said vehicle an exception shall be made to allow for the application for a parking permit.
- (2) This exception shall be limited to only one company automobile per household.
- (3) Under this exception, company automobiles will be assigned to park in a Borough parking lot if space is available. Efforts will be made to provide a space most proximate to the resident co-signer’s address. Company automobiles assigned to a lot must park in the assigned lot or will be subject to ticketing, regardless of obtaining a permit.
- (4) In the event that the lot for which a resident, who has not exceeded the permit limit, applies is at capacity and there are excepted company automobiles that have been permitted to park in that lot, the excepted company automobile will be reassigned to either another lot (if space is available), or to park on an eligible street.

§ 193-40. Permit administration.

- A. All permits for the following year shall be purchased by current residents by December 31 of the current year. There is no discounted rate for current residents, regardless of when permit is purchased.
- B. However, a resident who purchases a permit after June 30 may purchase a permit at one-half of the yearly cost.
- C. The permit shall be displayed on the registered vehicle in an area, as determined by the administrator, so as to be readily visible from the street.

§ 193-41. Permit fees.

All fees for on-street and Borough lot parking permits will be established by resolution by the Edgewood Borough Council.⁵

§ 193-42. Permit provisions.

5. Editor’s Note: See Ch. 118, Fees.

- A. To park on a street, where it is legally permissible to do so, between 3:00 a.m. – 5:00 a.m., requires a permit.
- B. Permits will be limited to one permit per resident per corresponding registered vehicle for either an on-street or Borough lot permit. However if there are unused spaces in a Borough lot a resident can also buy a second permit for the lot.
- C. On-street parking permits are nontransferable.
- D. All on-street parking permits are issued for one year from January 1 – December 31.
- E. Caregiver on-street parking permits are nontransferable between households. However, caregiver on-street parking permits may be transferred between caregivers providing such service at a given household.

§ 193-43. Borough parking lots.

- A. Borough residential parking lot permits will be provided on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- B. Every resident, not exceeding the limit established in § 193-42B of this article, will have the opportunity to apply for at least one parking permit for a space in a Borough lot.
- C. Application must be made for the lot that is geographically closest to the resident's household.
- D. The deadline to apply for a Borough lot parking space is November 20 at 5:00 p.m. of every year. In the event that November 20 is on a weekend, the application must be completed and delivered to the Borough Building by 5:00 p.m. of the first business day that follows.
- E. If there are more spaces available in a given lot than applications for permits to park in that lot, up to two spaces may be provided per household.
- F. Spaces in lots will be numbered and permits will authorize the recipient of a permit to park only in the specified numbered space assigned by the administrator, or his or her designee.
- G. In the event that there are more permit applications than available spaces for a given lot, a lottery, overseen by the administrator, or his or her designee, will be held on December 1 at 9:00 a.m. In the event that December 1 is on a weekend, the lottery will be held at 9:00 a.m. on the first business day that follows.
- H. In the event that a lottery is necessary for a given lot, then only one space can be provided per household for that lot.
- I. All Borough residential parking lot permits are issued for one year from January 1 – December 31.
- J. In the event that the lot for which a resident applies is at capacity and there are no nonresidents who have been permitted to park in that lot, the resident may apply for a space in the next closest lot, which has a vacancy.
- K. In the event that the lot for which a resident applies is at capacity and there are nonresidents who have been permitted to park in that lot, a nonresident parking in that lot will be reassigned to either another lot (if space is available), or to park on an eligible street. Priority is to be given to Edgewood residents.

- L. Parking lot permits are not transferable. A permit allows for eligibility to park only in the lot to which the permit is assigned.

§ 193-44. Commercial or recreational vehicles in Borough lots.

- A. The Borough will issue a total of 10 permits for commercial or recreational vehicles, allowing parking only in the lot on Race Street behind the Borough building.
- B. A resident may apply for a commercial or recreational vehicle permit subject to availability.
- C. If there are more applications than available spaces, a lottery, exactly as described in § 193-43G will be held.

§ 193-45. Initial administration.

- A. The initial deadline to apply for a Borough lot parking space is 5:00 p.m. of the 20th of the month following the adoption of this article. In the event that the 20th day following adoption of this article is on a weekend, the application must be completed and delivered to the Borough building by 5:00 p.m. of the first business day that follows.
- B. In the event that during initial administration there are more permit applications than available spaces for a given lot, a lottery, overseen by the administrator, or his or her designee, will be held at 9:00 a.m. on the 10th day following the initial deadline to apply for a Borough lot parking space. In the event that the 10th day following the initial deadline to apply for a Borough lot parking space is on a weekend, the lottery will be held at 9:00 a.m. on the first business day that follows.

§ 193-48. (Reserved)**§ 193-49. (Reserved)****ARTICLE VII****Immobilization, Removal and Impounding of Scofflaws' Vehicles****§ 193-50. Authority.**

- A. The Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 6102 and 6109(a)(22), and the Borough Code, 53 P.S. §§ , empower the Borough to enact ordinances and regulations for operation of parking regulations, and to adopt traffic and vehicle regulations necessary for the safety and general welfare of the residents and visitors of the Borough.
- B. The Edgewood police, upon authorization by the Chief of Police, shall remove the motor vehicle by private commercial equipment to a suitable storage facility as determined by the Borough. The commercial facility must be an approved storage facility and a certificate of insurance must be provided by the operator.

§ 193-51. Intent; purpose.

- A. The Mayor, Police Chief, Public Safety Committee and Borough Council, after a judicious analysis of the enforcement background of the parking ordinances and the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, have determined the need for additional legislation to deal with scofflaws or those who flout the law and fail to pay fines owed.
- B. The purpose of this article is to protect the public, promote safety and safeguarding of property, remove traffic hazards, abate public nuisances arising from traffic law violations, and to protect the public's right to use Borough streets and thoroughfares.

§ 193-52. Removal and impoundment.

Any unattended motor vehicle found parked on any Borough street, alley or Borough parking lot with five or more unpaid or unsettled traffic or parking tags, summonses, citations or other processes, in violation of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code or the Borough traffic ordinances is considered a public nuisance and the Edgewood Police Department, upon authorization from the Chief of Police, may remove and impound the vehicle to any place designated Borough or may immobilize the vehicle in a manner as to prevent its operation. Only the motor vehicle will be subject to immobilization and shall be immobilized by means that will cause no damage while in the parked position. Impoundment or immobilization as provided in this section may be done by personnel authorized by the Chief of Police.

§ 193-53. Notice to owner.

Whenever the Edgewood Borough Police Department impounds a vehicle under this article, notice of the removal and storage place of the vehicle shall be mailed to the last registered

owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle. The notice shall state that if the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle fail to reclaim the vehicle within 60 days from the date of the mailing, title to the vehicle will vest in the Borough of Edgewood, and the vehicle shall be sold at public auction not sooner than 30 days after the expiration of the sixty-day period.

§ 193-54. Warning notice; tampering with device; unclaimed immobilized vehicles.

- A. The person under whose direction the vehicle is removed or immobilized shall inform the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle of the reason that the vehicle was impounded or immobilized. Authorized personnel shall place a warning notice on the vehicle state that any attempt to move the vehicle might result in damage to the vehicle.
- B. Tampering with the immobilization device shall be a separate offense and may be prosecuted under the Pennsylvania Crimes Code, for criminal mischief, 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 3304; and for theft, 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 3921.
- C. The Borough of Edgewood assumes no responsibility and shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the vehicle while immobilized.
- D. If the immobilized vehicle remains unclaimed for a period of 72 hours, the Chief of Police shall have the authority to order removal of the vehicle at the expense of the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle.

§ 193-55. Responsibilities of owner of vehicle.

The registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle with five or more unpaid or unsettled traffic or parking tags, summonses, citations or other processes against it shall be responsible for all accrued fines and costs for each outstanding or unsettled traffic or parking violation, and charges for immobilization, towing, storage and other charges, except an unforeseen medical emergency or death in the family causing the vehicle to remain on the street for an extended period of time, or where proof is presented that the vehicle had been stolen and had not been returned to the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle by the dates of the violations. The release shall be signed by the Chief of Police.

§ 193-56. Release of vehicle.

Vehicles immobilized or impounded under this article shall be released to the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle upon presenting proof of ownership or acceptable evidence of a right to its possession and upon paying all accrued fines and costs for each outstanding or unsettled traffic or parking violation and the charges for immobilization, towing, storage and other charges.

§ 193-57. Claim by owner of unauthorized action.

- A. If the registered owners or person entitled to possession of the vehicle claim that the immobilization, removal and/or impoundment was not authorized, a written request may be submitted to the Borough to schedule a Vehicle Immobilization Hearing before the District Justice. The sole issue to be determined at the hearing shall be whether five or more unpaid or unsettled traffic or parking tags, summonses, citations or other processes were issued against the vehicle and remain unpaid.
- B. If the District Justice rules that the immobilization, removal and or/impoundment was unauthorized or unjustified, the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle shall be entitled to immediate release and return of the vehicle with no charges for immobilization, removal and/or impoundment.
- C. If the District Justice rules that five or more unpaid or unsettled traffic or parking tags, summonses, citations or other processes were issued and unpaid, the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle may obtain release of the vehicle by making payment of outstanding or unsettled traffic or parking violations and charges for immobilization, towing, storage and other charges.

§ 193-58. Sale of vehicle.

- A. If the impounded vehicle remains unclaimed for a period of 60 days from the day notice was mailed to registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle, Edgewood Borough may sell the vehicle at a public auction to the highest bidder for cash. The time and place of the sale shall be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Borough, not less than 10 days nor more than 15 days from the expiration of the 60 days. Notice shall contain a full description of the vehicle to be sold, time and place of sale. The proceeds of the sale shall be paid to the Borough of Edgewood minus lien settlement costs, towing, storage and immobilization charges and advertising and miscellaneous charges and fees.
- B. No Edgewood Borough employee, elected official or immediate family of an employee or elected official directly or indirectly is allowed to purchase or participate in the bidding or purchase of any vehicle offered for sale.
- C. If the value of the vehicle is determined to be insufficient to warrant storage and sale, the registered owners or persons entitled to possession of the vehicle shall be notified of its insufficient value. Within 60 days after the notification, the Borough of Edgewood shall notify the registered owners of persons entitled to possession of the vehicle that it intends to dispose of or destroy the vehicle through a licensed salvor. The vehicle shall be considered to be valueless abandoned property, and there shall be no claim against the Borough, nor any of its agents or employees, by reason of any such determination or disposition.

ARTICLE VIII
Snow and Ice Emergencies

§ 193-59. Declaration of snow and ice emergency.

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named pursuant to this article, the Borough Council, in its discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this article as a "snow emergency"). Information on the existence of a snow emergency may be given by the township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

§ 193-60. Parking and driving restrictions.

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

- A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated pursuant to this article; or
- B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

§ 193-61. Snow emergency routes.

The following streets or parts of streets are hereby designated as snow emergency routes.

§ 193-62. Snow emergency penalties.

- A. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this article, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 193-29 of this chapter.
- B. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under this article, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 193-63 of this chapter.

ARTICLE IX
Enforcement Remedies

§ 193-63. Violations and penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.) or except as herein specified,⁶ every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter, or any supplement thereto, shall be liable to a penalty of \$25 and costs of prosecution.
