

## **2022 Parking Permits**

Residents are now able to enter their information and pay for an overnight parking permit online. Permits will be mailed to purchasers thereby eliminating the need to appear in person to buy a permit at the borough building. Resident and visitor parking passes go on sale Wednesday, December 1, 2021. Passes can be purchased at www. edgewoodboro.com/parkingpermits.

Each driver with a vehicle registered in the Borough is able to purchase a Residential on-street parking pass. A Visitor's pass may also be purchased. Visitor passes may not be used on any vehicle registered within the Borough. The fees for on-street parking permits, as well as Borough off-street lots and recreational/commercial vehicles will be posted after council's budget meeting in mid-November.

Applications for the Borough's off-street parking lots will be accepted starting on December 1, 2021. On December 13, 2021, permits will be issued based upon requests. A lottery will be held If more applications are received than there are available parking spaces. No resident will be issued a second permit until all initial requests are processed.

## Phase II Administrative Consent Order

In 2016, Edgewood Borough and 82 other municipalities entered into a Consent Order and Agreement with the Allegheny County Health Department as part of a larger Wet Weather Plan for dealing with sewer overflows occurring at ALCOSAN's Woods Run Treatment Facility. The Order required municipalities in the ALCOSAN service territory to meet several obligations including performing annual inspection and maintenance of their sanitary sewer system, reduce groundwater infiltration into the sanitary sewer system, and develop plans for meeting the next phase of the Wet Weather Plan.

A final version of the Phase II Consent Order and Agreement was drafted over the summer after many rounds of negotiations between municipalities, state and federal regulatory agencies. The new Order must be executed by borough council by October 31, 2021. The new Order incorporates previous milestones defined in the prior Order as well as more aggressive standards for reducing overflows both within the borough and at facilities operated by ALCOSAN.

The borough's engineer will make a presentation to council at the October 4, 2021 council meeting. Anyone interested in learning more should plan to attend. The meeting starts at 7:30 p.m.

Voters have several decisions to make when they head to the polls on November 2, 2021. The positions of mayor, tax collector, and five borough council seats must be filled. ## SPOTLIGHT ON LOCAL BUSINESS

## Signs N' At

or this edition of Spotlight on Local Business, we spoke with Nathan Ward, General Manager of *Signs N' At*, at the Edgewood Towne Center. It is a family-owned small business that produces signage and other marketing materials, from business cards to large scale illuminated signs. This location is also an authorized FedEx ship center. Nathan, who has prior experience in the sign industry, decided to start up his own business with encouragement from his teenage son. He lives locally and loves this area, so it made sense to open his business here too. He's excited to invest his efforts back into the community and connect with the residents. The showroom and design center opened in January of this year.

He discussed his family ties to the region, noting their experience with Boy Scouts. He especially appreciates how the Scouts teach the idea of "leave no trace." That model has inspired him to think about how his business could reduce the impact that signs have on the environment and the community. He noted that yard signs, such as those used in political campaigning, are made of corrugated plastic, which can be completely recyclable when it is done properly. For that reason, Signs N' At, working with Gateway Recycling, collects signs dropped off by the public for recycling. They also perform LED conversions of existing signs, which reduces electricity usage and makes signs brighter.

When asked what he likes most about being in Edgewood, Nathan responded that, "I love walkable communities. In the summertime (and even in the winter if I bundle up!), I appreciate the ability to walk to work or to shop or eat. I enjoy being able to walk past houses and see the different types of architecture or the different flowers and shrubbery. As you can imagine, there's a lot of effort involved in running a business, and so if I can have that 20-minute walk to clear my mind for a little bit, it's invaluable."

## Fall is Tree Planting Season!!

Trees play a huge role in making Edgewood a great place to live. Aside from their beauty, they also cool and clean the air and lower resident's utility bills—more important than ever as the climate continues to warm. The borough is fortunate to have a high percentage of canopy cover compared to other nearby neighborhoods. But, many of Edgewood's grand old trees are approaching the end of their natural life. To avoid large loss of canopy and the many benefits mature trees offer, it's important to plant young trees now wherever good spaces for them can be found.

UpstreamPgh has planted hundreds of street trees over the past 20 years. They are a great tool for stormwater management, but they face a daunting environment. Most street trees don't live as long as those planted in someone's yard due to the many stresses and dangers they face—lack of adequate water, intense heat, winter salt, car doors opening into them, etc. To help insure that our urban forest continues to thrive, UpstreamPgh instituted the Citizen Tree Project three years ago to provide young trees for residents to plant in their yards so they can be given the care needed to help them survive their first few years.

We are now recruiting participants for this year's Citizen Tree Project; trees will be distributed in October and November. If you are interested in planting a small tree on your property please visit the Citizen Tree Project page on our website at www.upstreampgh.org to register.

All of the orchestra's virtual performances from this past season are still accessible on YouTube.




## **Blessing of the Pets**


