From The Manager's Desk

Homeowners looking to install solar panels on their homes have a new resource at their disposal. Edgewood Borough recently joined with Solar United Neighbors to launch the 2022 Allegheny County Solar Co-op. With their help and expertise, co-op members can leverage their numbers to get a group rate on quality solar installations. There is no cost to join and no obligation to install! Become a member today at www.solarunitedneighbors.org/allegheny. Be sure to ask about electric vehicle charging options too. The deadline to join the co-op is July 31, 2022.

Under the borough's zoning ordinance, roof and building mounted solar panels are permitted in all zoning districts but require building and electrical permits.

What is a solar co-op?

A solar co-op is a nonprofit, consumer-focused program administered by Solar United Neighbors (SUN) to make it easier for homeowners and small businesses to install solar panels. Each co-op is open to anyone with an electric bill in the co-op's designated geography (in this case, Allegheny County). People can join the co-op for free and receive detailed technical guidance on going solar and access to an exclusive group price from a competitively selected solar installer. Solar co-ops accelerate solar adoption by lowering the price of an installation and educating consumers on how to go solar in an informed way.

Who is SUN?

Solar United Neighbors is a national 501(c)3 nonprofit organization dedicated to building a cleaner and fairer energy system with rooftop solar as the cornerstone. SUN is vendor-neutral; solar co-op members select the installer which services their group, not SUN. Partnership with SUN does not entail an endorsement of any private company. SUN has operated over 300 solar co-ops across the USA, including 12 in Pennsylvania, helping 6,200 people install 51 MW of solar energy, investing over \$132,000,000 in regional economies and creating almost 900 green jobs.

SPOTLIGHT ON LOCAL BUSINESS

Steiner Realty

e spoke with Casey Steiner, President and CEO of Steiner Realty, 100 E. Swissvale Avenue, to learn more about this local business, and their presence in the community. Mr. Steiner told us he has been part of the business since he was 11, painting apartments, but officially became a part of the company in 1985. Steiner Realty, Inc is a Pittsburgh-based brokerage firm, owned and operated by Clarance H. (Casey) Steiner since 1989. It originally started as a family group that owned and managed properties since the 1950's. They now manage over 1,700 rental units in the greater Pittsburgh region, including lofts, complexes, high-rises, as well as single-family and townhouses. Twenty-five of these properties are here in Edgewood. In 2018 they added a Home Sales division, offering residential brokerage services. A staff of more than 60 employees handles all of the various aspects of the business, and Mr. Steiner tells us that he is delighted to have his two children, Lily and Ben, continuing the family business with him.

Mr. Steiner's family moved to Edgewood in 1965 when he was in the second grade. He said that his parents chose Edgewood "for the good schools and for a large house to house five

children!" He graduated from Edgewood High and holds a B.A. from Haverford College, and a law degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is a member of the Pennsylvania Bar and a licensed Pennsylvania real estate broker. Casey likes to be active in the community and has served on the Edgewood Borough Council and as a Board Member of the Edgewood Foundation and the Edgewood Symphony.

When asked about some of his favorite things about Edgewood, Mr. Steiner replied that he likes "Edgewood's unique feel of a quiet, established community, but with easy access to Oakland, Downtown and the exciting East End of Pittsburgh. We've enjoyed the walkability of Edgewood. There are terrific restaurants and shops, and of course the CC Mellor Library. The proximity to Frick Park has always been one of its greatest assets. I love to hike and bike in the park. Edgewood is also very welcoming to new people, for example with the Edgewood Foundation's annual Newcomer's Reception and Progressive Dinner. The Community Day celebration is a great way to meet up with your neighbors and enjoy some good food and music. We also benefit from the Edgewood Community Orchestra. Not many small neighborhoods have such an amazing orchestra to call their own! I also appreciate our Mayors and Borough Councilpersons who have consistently provided good leadership that can address local concerns effectively over the years."



Edgewood Borough Named 2022 Banner Community

Edgewood Borough has been recognized as a 2022 Banner Community by County Executive Rich Fitzgerald and the Allegheny League of Municipalities (ALOM). This marks the tenth year of the program which recognizes municipalities that show a commitment to professional development, prudent fiscal management, transparency, accountability, and proactive communications to engage community stakeholders. Edgewood Borough is one of 80 organizations recognized this year.

"Borough Council is constantly working to maintain and improve the quality of life our residents enjoy here in Edgewood," said borough council president Dr. Justin Petrolla. "Both council and staff are tasked with being responsible stewards of public money while also finding innovative ways to meet the ever-changing needs of our residents. I am proud of my colleagues for their dedication and commitment to good governance."

In order to be eligible for consideration for the Banner Communities Program, the municipality's elected and appointed officials must:

- Participate in educational or training programs through ALOM, the Local Government Academy or the PA Department of Community & Economic Development or participate in a governing mentoring program
- Be active members in good standing with ALOM and the county municipal associations, and have a representative attending at least a minimum of 50% of county association meetings
- Be active members in good standing in a COG and attend COG meetings, participate in a COG cooperative purchasing program and participate in at least one shared municipal service
- Conduct a Local Government Week activity by conducting a local activity promoting local government or communicating with the community about delivery of services
- Conduct an effective Citizen Communication Program by offering a municipal newsletter or webbased communication effort, and participate in a class discussion on local government or conducting a shadowing program for junior or senior high school students
- Promote and implement long term sustainable governing practices by earning certification through Sustainable Pittsburgh, managing employee pensions at funding levels of 90% or above, participating in the annual ALOM Wage and Salary Survey Program, and implementing goals of an up to date Municipal Comprehensive Plan.



The Allegheny League of Municipalities, a nonprofit organization created in the early 1960s to coordinate the needs of the area's local elected officials. In 1974, it was officially established as the Allegheny League of Municipalities to coordinate, advocate and educate the hundreds of elected officials within its member municipalities in Allegheny County and southwestern Pennsylvania. The organization educates elected officials, delivers essential resources, and advocates for sound policy and legislation.

Koenig Field Usage

We are happy to see Koenig Field continue to be a space that residents can use to maintain their physical and mental health. Covid 19 safety info: We continue to follow CDC and State and local guidelines. As long as transmission rates remain low, masks will be optional. 



A note from the real estate tax collector...

George Fuller was elected in November 2021 to a four-year term as Tax Collector starting in 2022. He has chosen to deputize Jordan Tax Service to perform tax collection on his behalf.
