Code Enforcement Reminders

Property owners in Edgewood are responsible for maintaining their sidewalks and curbs. Please take advantage of the summer weather to address any cracked, crumbling, or offset sidewalk sections and curbs. Please remember to keep your grass under 6 inches in height. Lastly, garbage cans are to be set out no earlier than 6 p.m. on the evening before collection and must be removed by 5 p.m. on the day of collection. All refuse must be placed in containers to avoid spillage and attracting rodents. Recyclables must be placed into a container and be free of plastic bags.

2022 Road Paving Program

Borough Council budgets \$400,000 annually to pave borough streets. The streets are ranked based on their condition by the borough engineer and an annual list is established. The following streets are proposed for the 2022 paving program:

Laurel Street Playground

The Laurel Street playground structure will be replaced in late summer with an inclusive and accessible ages 2-12 play structure. A swing set, merry-go-round, and interactive percussion kit is also part of the replacement. The families of Laurel Street are planning a fundraiser to pay for picnic tables at the site. Please keep an eye out for their lemonade stand over the summer.



Intersection improvements

Edgewood Borough received a PennDOT grant to study two difficult intersections in the borough; Race Street at West Swissvale Avenue and Maple Avenue at Brinton Road. Consulting engineer Trans Associates drafted plans for each intersection which were reviewed and approved by the public safety committee and borough council. Changes will be made to both intersections by years end to improve pedestrian and vehicular safety.

The most notable change at the Race Street and West Swissvale intersection will be the requirement that vehicles turning right onto W. Swissvale from Race share the same lane as those vehicles turning left or staying straight and that those vehicles stop before turning right. This eliminates the sight obstruction created when another vehicle turning left or driving straight is stopped in the intersection. Delineators will be installed in the intersection to narrow the travel lane width and shorten the crossing distance for pedestrians. Additional signage will be installed warning large trucks of the height restrictions posed by the Race Street tunnel.

Changes to the Maple Avenue and Brinton Road intersection will eliminate the visual obstruction present when a vehicle headed south onto Brinton Road and a vehicle headed west onto Maple Avenue stop at the same time. This will be accomplished by reducing the southern approach lane of Brinton to a single lane and requiring all turns be made from the western Maple Avenue approach. The concrete island will be reconstructed to improve the turning radius and the Brinton Road stop sign currently located on the I-376 overpass will be relocated 30' closer to the new intersection.

ZONING HEARING BOARD VACANCY

A vacancy currently exists on the borough's three-person zoning hearing board. The purpose of the board is to hear challenges to and render decisions on challenges to the borough's zoning ordinance. These challenges are more commonly referred to as variances. Applicants for a variance typically seek relief from limitations to the size of signs permitted or a yard buffer requirement to construct a deck or patio. Decisions are binding and not subject to approval by borough council. The person selected by borough council would be appointed to fill the remainder of a term expiring at the end of 2022. This is a volunteer position. Interested candidates should sent a letter of interest as soon as possible to manager@edgewoodboro.com for consideration by borough council.

On Sunday April 24 the Edgewood Foundation hosted a celebration brunch for Edgewood graduating Seniors at the Edgewood Club.






