2022 Road Paving Program

Borough Council authorized a \$480,566 contract with A. Liberoni for road paving and reconstruction of the following streets:

- Short Race St. from West Hutchinson Ave. to Greendale Ave.
- Race St. from Greendale Ave. to Pennwood Ave.
- Locust St. from Hawthorne St. to Beech St.
- Full reconstruction of Pliney Way from East End Ave. to Allenby Ave.
- Full reconstruction of Koenig tennis courts.
- Reprofiling of Horace Way.

The program includes catch basin repairs and drainage improvements where necessary and the installation of new ADA compliant sidewalk ramps at all intersections. Curb repairs are performed only in conjunction with ramp installation, deficiencies located outside of the ramp are the responsibility of the property owner. Work shall commence late summer or early fall.

SPOTLIGHT ON LOCAL BUSINESS

The Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf

With this 'Spotlight' article, instead of a local businesses, we decided to feature an institution that has been part of our community since it was founded, the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf. You may have noticed some construction going on at the campus this summer (find out more in their article on page 5). We reached out to a representative from the school, Sarah Bartlebaugh, to find out a little more about the school.

Founded in 1869, the Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf (WPSD) is a non-profit, tuition free school that provides quality educational services, engaging athletic opportunities, and a complete extracurricular program to Deaf and hard-of-hearing students. With funding from a variety of foundations and friends, a charter was obtained in 1869. The school grew from eight students on the first day to the highest enrollment of over 500 students in the 1960's. WPSD moved to the current location in Edgewood in 1884. The original Edgewood school building burned down in 1899, and the current building opened in 1901.

Over the years, WPSD started to offer other programs, including the statewide early intervention initiative - Choices for Children, The Scranton School for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children, serving children in Northeast PA, Children's Center at Edinboro and the Children's Central Pennsylvania in Hershey. Today WPSD is the largest comprehensive center for deaf education in Pennsylvania.

More than 40% of the student body lives in the school's Residence, while the remainder commute from home daily. As residents have noticed during the school year, there is a steady stream of buses visiting campus every day. If students live more than an hour away (mostly Central/Eastern PA), they are considered residential. The Residential Program, open to students from preschool through 12th grade is an integral part of the school. Staff provides care and guidance in a structured, family-like, environment.

WPSD offers a challenging curriculum based on state and national standards, including unique STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, math) opportunities in computer science, 3-D printing, and robotics. WPSD hosts a thriving performing and visual arts program with students performing in a variety of school plays and the campus television studio, which gives students experience producing a weekly news program and movies, which often win awards in local competitions. All students can participate in after-school programs, including a variety of clubs and sports, such as soccer, basketball, volleyball, track and field, and cheerleading.

WPSD offers an all-inclusive communication/language environment. Individual student needs determine the communication with emphasis on the development of both English and American Sign Language. Throughout the year, WPSD offers American Sign Language classes, open to the community, at a variety of skill levels, in three sessions through the school year. Currently, classes are offered only online, but the school is hoping to start offering in-person classes soon. Residents are encouraged to visit the school's website—wpsd.org or Facebook page for more information about the costs and when to register for the classes.

In 2006, WPSD, in collaboration with officials from Edgewood and Wilkinsburg, founded the Commitment to the Community Committee, which provides a public forum to enhance inter-community communication and collaboration, address neighborhood blight, redevelopment, safety

issues, and the need for economic development in the area. Today, this collaboration includes officials and residents of the communities of Edgewood, Wilkinsburg, Swissvale, and Forest Hills. WPSD recognizes the value of the school as an educational and economic asset to Edgewood and the surrounding municipalities, and its obligation to maintain a leadership role in community development and improve the stability and vitality of these communities. Our annual Community Block Party is a vital outgrowth of this initiative.

"We cherish the relationships the school has built with the community through the years. We have come to depend on each other in good times and in bad. WPSD's goal is to continue to strengthen and deepen the school's bond with residents and borough officials and continue to invest in Edgewood for years to come."

We at the Borough of Edgewood can attest to the strong relationship that we share with the school, and we're very happy to have them as such an integral part of our community.










Big things are happening on the WPSD Campus

Over the summer, construction crews will be working to transform part of campus into a beautiful and safe space our students and staff will enjoy for decades to come. These renovations are designed to improve the movement of vehicles and students on campus and reduce bus traffic on the streets around the school.





Through work sessions and focus groups, student safety was identified as the top priority for the new campus master plan. Discussions involved multiple conceptual studies looking at student arrival and dropoff, vehicle staging on and of campus, and pedestrian circulation. The best way to achieve this goal was to establish an avenue for buses to travel through campus and create a single consolidated parking lot along Swissvale Avenue for teachers, staff, and visitors. This new amenity alleviates parking pressure in the surrounding neighborhoods.

To create 'curb appeal,' the project will include large rain gardens, canopy trees, and native plants. This plan helped to protect the largest number of historically significant trees on

campus to ensure that we captured the benefits and beauty of their existing canopy. In addition, the existing landscape is being replaced, in this first phase alone, with 86 new trees, almost 500 new shrubs and over 2700 new ornamental grasses and perennials. In an effort to be a responsible partner in the local watershed, an underground stormwater structure will be installed under the new parking area to manage the release of rainwater from campus.

The goal is to have all work completed prior to our students' return to school in August. We are excited about the positive impact this project will make, not only for our students, but for the surrounding community as well. WPSD understands, and takes seriously, its responsibility to invest in Edgewood and beyond.





Newcomers Reception

Each year (except during global pandemics), the Edgewood Foundation sponsors a reception for newcomers who have moved into the Borough in the preceding year. This event is our way of formally welcoming them into the neighborhood and to introduce them to, not only their other fellow newcomers, but also Borough officials and other involved citizens and members of the local organizations.

The reception was historically hosted at an Edgewood resident's house but in recent years, due to the popularity of the event, we have used the Train Station and The Edgewood Club so we can accommodate everyone and utilize the outdoor spaces available. The location for this year's event will be at the Train Station and refreshments and beverages will be provided.



All sessions will start at 6 p.m. This is a free program but registration is required.


Love Your Library

Why Woodland Hills School District

Woodland Hills School District establishes leadership team for 2022-23 school year, hires building principals for high school, middle school

NORTH BRADDOCK—July 14, 2022—The Woodland Hills School District has established its leadership team for the 2022-23 school year and has hired building principals for the high school and Dickson Preparatory STEAM Academy. The hires were approved by the Woodland Hills School District Board of School Directors during a special legislative meeting held on Thursday, July 14, 2022.

Shelly Manns and Berchman Grinage, Jr. have been hired as co-principals at Woodland Hills High School. Ms. Manns served as the interim high school principal for the 2021-22 school year and will have a concentrated focus on 11th and 12th grade. Mr. Grinage comes to Woodland Hills from Pittsburgh Public Schools and will have a focus on 9th and 10th grade. Rounding out the high school administration will be Assistant Principal Marisa Bragg, Assistant Principal Michelle Collins, Assistant to the Director of Pupil Personnel Marlon Youngblood, and Dean of Students Timothy Brown. Mr. Brown comes to Woodland Hills from the McKeesport Area School District while Ms. Bragg, Ms. Collins and Mr. Youngblood were part of the high school team last year.


