Tennis court update

We are waiting for our fencing contractor to receive the vinyl coated fence that will separate the upper and lower court. This item is currently difficult to procure in the height needed even though it has been on order for several months. Once installed, the court configuration will allow for either two separate games of tennis, four separate games of pickleball, or one game of tennis and two pickleball games at the same time. The courts were designed primarily for tennis but were also striped to accommodate pickleball players using portable nets. The nets can be moved into and out of place depending on which sport a patron would like to play. Spotted Lanternfly

These invasive species feed on a number of prevalent trees in Pennsylvania including Black Walnut, Maple, Birch and Willow. They excrete a sugary substance called Honeydew that attracts bees, wasps and other insects and causes mold growth which can cover both the tree and anything under it. There are a number of excellent resources for dealing with this invasive pest offered by the Penn State Extension office: **www.extension.psu.edu/spotted-lanternfly**. It's also perfectly fine to squish them, stomp them, or otherwise eliminate them.



Koenig Field Usage

We are happy to see Koenig Field continue to be a space that residents can use to maintain their physical and mental health. As the weather warms and field use increases we ask that all field visitors be respectful to one another and follow the field rules which are posted on the bulletin board on the field house.

Field Reservations

Groups or individuals engaged in an organized (i.e. leagues, social clubs, amateur associations, etc) sporting activity are required to apply for and receive a field use permit. Individuals or groups wanting dedicated tennis or pickleball court time are encouraged to reserve their desired space to ensure access. Establishing a field use permit system ensures that field space is available for both groups and individuals to maximize recreational opportunities while ensuring equity amongst all users.

Scheduling preference will be given to Edgewood residents and then to other leagues, groups, clubs and associations. All facilities are open to the public unless otherwise reserved for organized use. The public may use all other parts of Koenig Field at any time that are not reserved for organized play.





Skin Cancer Awareness

Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States. Basal and squamous cell cancers are the most common types of skin cancer. Melanoma is less common but can be a more serious type of skin cancer.

Prevention and early detection can reduce the risks of this disease. Wearing a broad spectrum sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher, hats, sunglasses and long sleeved clothing can help reduce ultraviolet exposure. Requesting yearly skin cancer screenings from a primary care physician or dermatologist can diagnose cancer at an earlier stage.


Louise DeRiso, an Edgewood resident and Adult Nurse Practitioner will be hosting a booth during Community Day on August 26 promoting sun safety. Residents are welcome to visit the booth and learn more about skin cancer and ways it can be prevented. Children will get a Sun Safety Kit which includes sunscreen samples, Sun Hero branded swag, and more.

She also helped to facilitate a grant award through Sun Smart Pittsburgh to receive a free Sunscreen Dispenser that will be placed in Koenig Field. Sun Smart Pittsburgh is a non-profit organization started by two local dermatologists, Drs. Christie Regula and Justin Vujevich whose mission is to promote sun protection and skin cancer prevention through installation of sunscreen dispensers in communities. We thank them for their generous donation!




