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#### BOROUGH OF EDGEWOOD MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF COUNCIL HELD AUGUST 3, 2009

Council President Schaefer called the Meeting of the Council of the Borough of Edgewood to order on Monday, August 3, 2009 at 7:36 PM in the Municipal Building.

## ROLL CALL

Borough Manager Warren Cecconi called the roll and the following responded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer.

Mr. Shultz was absent.

Mayor Jean O. Davin was present and Solicitor W. Timothy Barry arrived at 7:50 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

# **ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR**

Ms. Benko of 534 Greendale Avenue had questions regarding the June 17, 2009 flooding and when a meeting would convene with Council.

Ms. Schaefer offered the sewer tapes for review by the residents.

Mr. Cecconi noted that the lower half of the Greendale Avenue sewer line that runs from Greendale Avenue through Nine Mile run needs to be televised to detect any major problems and evaluate any obstacles which might be present.

Mr. Cohen of 601 Greendale asked about crosswalks being placed on South Braddock Avenue at Greendale. Ms. Schaefer felt that a traffic study was needed.

Mr. Cohen also had questions regarding the sale and use of the Train Station, stating that his wife thought Western Pennsylvania School for the Deaf might use this building as a vocational site for its students.

# AUTHORIZATION TO PAY BILLS

M-1 Ms. McDonald moved to authorize the payment of bills, for goods and services received by the Borough, having been reviewed and approved by the General Government Committee in the amount of \$76,607.84. Second by Mr. Cook.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. **Resolution Passes.** 

# M-4 Ms. McDonald moved to advertise for a Public Hearing on September 7, 2009 at 7:00 PM to receive input on the Joint Comprehensive Plan prior to consideration of adoption by Council. Second by Mr. Reynolds.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Schaefer gave an overview of the background to the Comprehensive Plan and said that the Public Hearing is a step toward adopting the Plan.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. **Motion carried**.

#### M-5 Ms. McDonald moved to have Lennon Smith Souleret Engineers prepare specifications and advertise for bids for the 2009 road paving. Streets include Edgewood Avenue from Oakview to Gordon and Gordon from Chestnut to Westmoreland. Second by Mr. Fuller.

DISCUSSION: Mayor Davin questioned the lateness of the season to begin this.

Mr. Cecconi assured the Mayor that no one is booked up this year. He indicated that this is probably a two-day job and, if the contractor is not able to complete the job, then the prices will be held for next year.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. **Motion carried**.

# M-6 Mr. Hellett moved to increase the wages of all full-time Public Works employees by \$1.50 per hour effective August 3, 2009. Second by Mr. Cook.

DISCUSSION: Mayor Davin felt that she needed to sign this as this is legislative in nature. Solicitor Barry agreed.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. **Motion carried**.

M-7 Mr. Reynolds moved to award the Train Station Renovation Project to SI Contracting, LLC, the lowest responsible bidder, in the amount of \$88,200.00, as recommended by Robert Grubb, the architect. Second by Mr. Cook. DISCUSSION: Ms. Schaefer expressed thanks to Mr. Reynolds for his time and effort on this project. She stated that this has been in the works for a long time and Mr. Reynolds moved it forward.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Ms. McDonald, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. **Motion carried**.

## VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Halle reported that thirty two (32) fire calls were made in July, including one for a jackknifed tractor trailer on the parkway.

Penn Dot, according to Mr. Halle, used some Volunteer Fire Department equipment and has since replaced all materials used.

Preparations are being finalized for Community Day and Mr. Halle said fried dough will also be sold. He reported that the dinners will remain at their \$8.00 price.

Mr. Cecconi also reported that he has received several catalogs for equipment for the playground.

DISCUSSION: Ms. Schaefer explained to the audience that Council is contemplating moving the Tot Lot to the basketball court. She stated that this would require new equipment and Mr. Cecconi has been in contact with various representatives to see if they would sponsor grant money.

Mr. Cecconi went on to say that PEMA visited on Friday and that the next step would be their consideration of a disaster declaration for Allegheny County.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

M-8 Mr. Hellett moved to approve the resignation of Bruce Beitel from the Communications Department, effective August 21, 2009. Second by Mr. Cook.

DISCUSSION: None.

Upon roll call vote, the following was recorded: Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Fuller, Mr. Cook, Mr. Hellett, Ms. Schaefer voted yes. Ms. McDonald voted no. **Motion carried.** 

A Public Safety meeting was scheduled for August 10, 2009 at 8:00 PM.

Mayor Davin reported on the grant applications to obtain funding through Congressman Doyle's office and said that there will be a meeting August 11, 2009 held by the 3 Rivers Wet Weather Demonstration Project.

Mayor Davin also received an email from a resident regarding the Pittsburgh Film Office being on Savannah. Mr. Cecconi called the office and was told that no decision has been made.

Mr. Cook indicated that he will be going to State College to meet with their tree commission and how they deal with sidewalks and tree roots.

At 8:15, an Executive Session began, but no action was expected.
