MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING ON MARCH 16, 2015

CALL TO ORDER

President Schaefer called the meeting of the Borough of Edgewood to order at 7:00 pm in the Municipal Building.

ROLL CALL

Solicitor Barry and Mayor Cook were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ITEMS FROM THE FLOOR

President Schaefer asked for items from the floor to hear public comment on the Proposed Ordinance Number 1050 – Urban Chicken Keeping, Proposed Ordinance Number 1051 –Stormwater Management and Proposed Ordinance 1052 –MS4 Prohibited Discharge.

Ben Love -112 Race Street

Mr. Love asked if the three chicken limit was in effect regardless of lot size. Ms. Schaefer said that it was. Mr. Love also asked what the ramifications would be if the Borough did not receive an MS4 permit. Ms. Schaefer said the Borough could face fines and punishments from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. Mr. Wainright discussed the process by which the urban chicken keeping ordinance was written, and Ms. Bastianini discussed the Stormwater Management and Prohibited Discharge ordinances.

M-1 Mr. Fuller moved to adjourn at 7:30 pm. Second by Mr. Wainright. The aye vote on the motion was unanimous. **Motion carried.**
