From The Manager's Desk

2026 Garbage Billing — The 2026 garbage collection bills have been mailed and are due at face by March 31, 2026. The rate remains unchanged at \$316 paid annually or \$79 paid in four installments. Like the annual payment, the first installment payment is due by March 31. Payments not submitted by March 31 are subject to monthly penalty and interest charges. All billing questions should be directed to Jordan Tax Service by dialing 724-731-2317

Parkway East Construction — PennDOT has announced the Parkway East will close to all traffic from July 10 – August 3, 2026 for the installation of the new Commercial Street bridge. Prior to that closure, additional improvement work will take place starting in early March and continue through May 2028 impacting the Parkway from the Churchill interchange to the Squirrel Hill Tunnel. Work includes median barrier replacement, street lighting upgrades, drainage work and bridge/overpass rehabilitation. Some of this work will cause delays on S. Braddock Avenue as work is performed on the overpasses and offramps.

To help keep drivers informed as work progresses, PennDOT has created an email distribution list for Parkway East traffic advisories and construction updates. Enroll by sending email addresses to ymanyisha@pa.gov. Please write "Subscribe – Parkway East" in the subject line.

Grant Award Announcement — The borough received a \$375,000 grant from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for planned 2027 work on the Nine Mile Run Culvert and Monongahela Alley reconstruction. The estimated \$1.2 million project is in design and will be bid in the fall of 2026. Thanks is given to State Senator Jay Costa and Representative Abigail Salisbury for their assistance with the application.

Street sweeping — A quick reminder that street sweeping resumes Wednesday April 1, 2026. Please observe all posted signs indicating when sweeping occurs on your street.

Don't Be Scammed this Tax Season

With tax season approaching, we want to remind residents to be aware of common tax scams.

Scammers often use phishing emails, text messages, or phone calls while posing as federal, state, or local tax agencies. Their goal is to obtain personal information such as Social Security numbers or dates of birth. They may use threats, urgency, or claims that your information needs to be updated. Caller ID or email addresses may appear legitimate due to a technique called "spoofing."

Remember:

- Tax agencies will not contact you by phone, text, or email to request personal information.
- Do not click links or open attachments in suspicious messages.
- Never share personal or financial information with unknown individuals.
- If you are unsure, look up the agency's official number and contact them directly.

Staying cautious can help protect you from tax-related scams.

Woodland Hills School District

Board elects Karen Lyons and Dr. Cynthia Wallace to leadership posts

The Woodland Hills School District Board of Directors elected Karen Lyons as its new president and Dr. Cynthia Wallace as its new vice president during its February 18, 2026 legislative meeting in the LGI Room at Woodland Hills High School.

The votes took place following the board's acceptance of the resignation of Terri Lawson as board president. Ms. Lyons had been serving as vice president and her elevation to president necessitated a vote to elect a new vice president. The board then approved Dr. Wallace for that position.

Ms. Lyons was initially appointed to the Board of Directors in October 2023 to fill a vacancy. She was re-elected for a new term in November 2025. Dr. Wallace won the election for her seat in November 2025.

Woodland Hills Robotics Teams Turn in Strong Performances

Several Woodland Hills School District robotics teams have reached new heights this school year. At the high school level, a team nicknamed "Catalyze Robotics" earned a season-best second place finish during a VEX V5 Robotics Competition on Saturday, February 14. They followed that up a week later by posting their highest individual skill score of the season during a competition at Keystone Oaks. The skills competition challenges teams to register as many points as possible in a set time through a combination of coding and driving.

Meanwhile, on February 21, three robotics teams earned honors that qualified them for the upcoming state championships. The teams competed in the VIQRC Bash at the Berry Dome in Cranberry, Pennsylvania. "Hardwired" earned the Excellence Award, the most prestigious award of any competition, which earned them a spot in the Western Pennsylvania Middle School State Qualifiers at PennWest Clarion University in March. "IQ Pandas" won both the Team Champion Runner-Up and the Design Award, the latter of which earned them qualification to the Western Pennsylvania Elementary State Qualifier at Penn West Clarion University in March. "Robotic Wolverines" also earned the most prestigious award in a competition, the Excellence Award, that qualified them for a spot at the Western Pennsylvania Elementary State Qualifiers.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. WHY SHOULD I BECOME A SUBSCRIBER TO EASTERN AREA PREHOSPITAL SERVICES (EAPS)?

A. Your paid subscription can save you hundreds of dollars! Subscribers receive a 50% discount on any out-of-pocket expenses after insurance is billed (deductibles, co-payments, etc.) related to medically necessary emergency ambulance service (provided by EAPS) to the closest appropriate medical facility. Your subscription also assures that EAPS will have the staff, vehicles and equipment required to provide around-the-clock emergency protection for you and your family.

Q. DO I NEED A SUBSCRIPTION IF I HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE?

A. Yes! Most insurance companies do not pay 100% of total ambulance charges. In fact, most insurance plans require that you pay a co-payment and/or deductible. Your paid subscription assures that you will receive a 50% discount on any of these out-of-pocket expenses – when related to emergency ambulance service provided by EAPS. Non-subscribers are often responsible for full payment of any and all applicable ambulance charges, which can exceed \$1,000.00 per trip. KEEP IN MIND: A paid subscription to Eastern Area Prehospital Services is NOT AN INSURANCE PLAN and does not replace your current insurance plan. However, it can provide valuable discounts if you need emergency ambulance service.

Q. HOW IS EAPS REIMBURSED IF I AM TRANSPORTED TO THE HOSPITAL?

A. In the event that you need emergency ambulance service, EAPS will submit a bill to your insurance company. Insurance payments are then applied to your balance. Once all insurance payments are applied, subscribers receive a 50% discount on any remaining out-of-pocket expenses for emergency ambulance services. The subscriber discount is applied – no matter how frequently you require medically necessary emergency ambulance service.

Q. WHAT IS NOT COVERED BY A SUBSCRIPTION?

- A. The following services ARE NOT covered by your subscription:
1. Certain ambulance transports (emergent and non-emergent), which may be denied or deemed outside the limits of your insurance coverage and/or do not meet established medical necessity criteria
 2. Any charges related to long distance ambulance mileage charges or transport fees, which are based solely on patient and/or physician preference
 3. Lift assists

Seniors – the state offers a wealth of programs and services to make life easier and more affordable. Here's a quick look at some of them. Please remember that our district office staffers are available to help you apply!

Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program. The rebate program allows income-eligible residents 65 or older, widows or widowers 50 or older, and disabled residents 18 or older to claim rebates on property taxes or rent paid in 2025. The qualifying income limit is \$48,110, and half of Social Security income is excluded. To learn more, visit www.revenue.pa.gov/ptra or contact our office.

PACE/PACENET. These programs provide prescription assistance for income-eligible seniors 65 or older. The PACENET program, which has

higher qualifying income limits, covers single people earning up to \$33,500 annually and married couples earning up to \$41,500 annually. To learn more, visit www.pa.gov/services and enter PACENET into the search bar.

I was proud to vote for legislation that will ensure that otherwise-eligible seniors are not disqualified because they received a cost-of-living adjustment.

Reduced vehicle registration fee. The state provides a reduced fee for retirees earning up to \$30,778 annually and waives the fee entirely for veterans who were injured in service, captured, or awarded certain medals. Visit www.pa.gov and enter "reduced registration" or "veterans registration" into the search bar.

To learn about additional state programs and services for seniors, including free Medicare counseling, housing programs, caregiver support, aging and disability resources, and more, visit www.aging.pa.gov and scroll down the page to the programs and services section. The mission of this scholarship program is to benefit Edgewood students while honoring the considerable legacy of Mel Douglass. Mel grew up here, graduated from Edgewood High School in 1970 and the University of Pittsburgh. He married his high school sweetheart, raised two wonderful children, and established a successful career in business. Before Mel passed in a 1994 airplane accident, he served Edgewood in multiple leadership roles ranging from volunteer fireman to Little League coach to church deacon. Mel will always be remembered for the wide circle of lives he enriched with his larger-than-life personality and his deep commitment to community service.

The Mel Douglass Fund, started by a group of Mel's Edgewood High School friends, has awarded scholarships annually since 2008. During our 18-year history, 114 Edgewood students have earned 22 Mel Douglass Scholarships and 92 honorable mention scholarships. Most of these recipients have graduated from college, are leading rewarding lives, and continuing to serve others. Several are even back in Edgewood!

The scholarships are presented each spring at the Edgewood Foundation's Senior Brunch. All college-bound seniors living in Edgewood are eligible and encouraged to apply. Historically, more than 75% of all applicants have been awarded scholarships. 
