Allegheny County Property Tax Assessment Public Hearings

The Council of Allegheny County will conduct two public hearings relating to property assessments:

- July 29, 2026 at 6 p.m., at the Wilkesburg Borough Building, 605 Ross Avenue, Wilkesburg, PA 15221
- August 12, 2026 at 5:30 p.m., at the Community College of Allegheny County Main Campus Auditorium, 808 Ridge Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15212

The purpose of these hearings is to allow the public opportunity to offer comment on proposed Bill No. 13892-26, which provides for regular reassessment of properties located within Allegheny County. Written testimony will also be accepted through August 21, 2026.

Individuals wishing to speak in person must register in advance at least 24 hours before the scheduled beginning of the meeting, and comments must be made in accordance with all applicable rules governing public comment at regularly scheduled Council meetings. 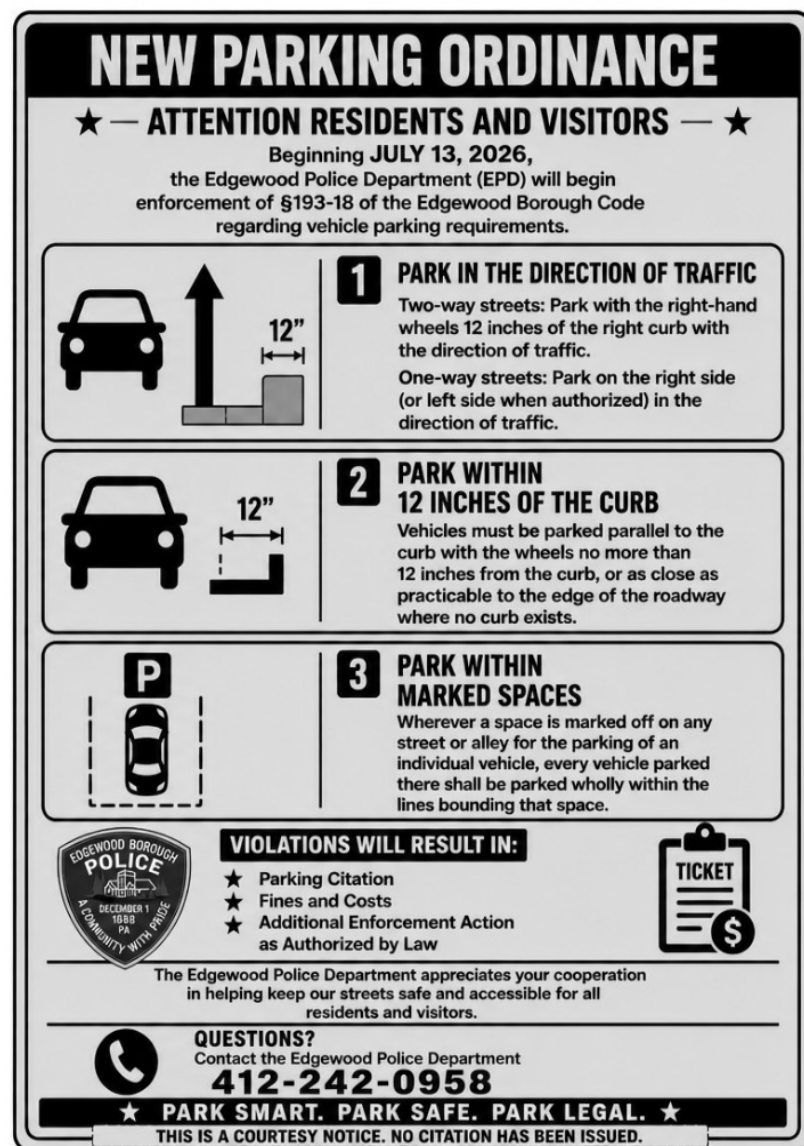

Parallel Parking Enforcement Begins

Recently, Edgewood Borough Council adopted an ordinance prohibiting parallel parking against the flow of traffic. Drivers must park with their right-hand wheels no more than 12 inches away from the right-hand curb or right-hand shoulder. This ordinance mirrors existing state motor vehicle code but adds a penalty of \$35 for each violation. The law takes effect July 13. Edgewood Borough Police have distributed several hundred warning citations over the last few weeks to educate violators.

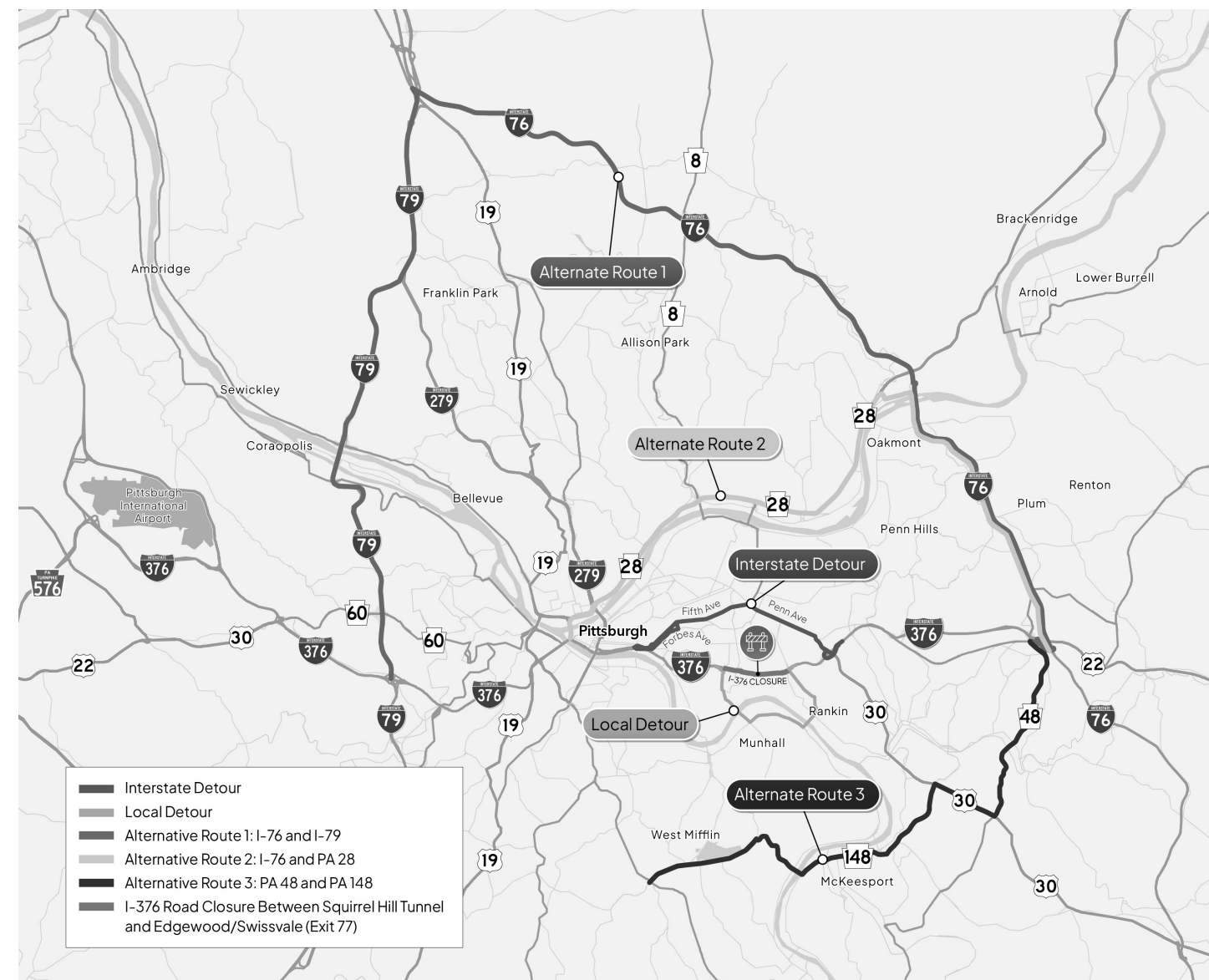


Commercial Street Bridge / Parkway East Closure

This is a reminder that the Parkway East will close from 9 p.m. July 10 until August 3 to allow for the demolition and replacement of the Commercial Street Bridge. Motorists will not be able to travel through either side (inbound or outbound) of the Squirrel Hill Tunnel during this time. Additional construction related closures and detours will remain in place during this closure. You can find out more by searching “Commercial Street Bridge Closure” in most internet search engines like Google, Yahoo, or Bing.

South Braddock Avenue is a posted detour route and will experience heavy traffic during the closure. Plan accordingly and allow extra time.

Mental Health Training

Currently, it is estimated that mental health diagnoses have increased significantly worldwide, and that more than one in five people in the United States experiences some form of mental illness. As peace officers, we are often among the first to encounter individuals experiencing a mental health crisis. Because of this, it is important that we are properly trained to recognize the signs of mental illness and equipped with the tools and resources necessary to handle these situations safely, professionally, and compassionately.

The Edgewood Police Department (EPD) is actively working to meet that responsibility by:

- Providing our officers with specialized training in areas such as crisis response and de-escalation techniques.
- Partnering with the A-Team, an organization that can respond independently or alongside EPD officers to assist individuals experiencing a mental health crisis.
- Equipping officers with less-lethal tools, including specialized shotguns that deploy rounds designed to temporarily disable an armed individual, such as someone experiencing a mental health crisis while armed with a knife.

As your neighbors, we will continue working to improve our training, resources, and partnerships so we can better serve every member of our community.

In this workshop you will learn everything you need to know to start harvesting rainwater. Notes from the House: Pushing for transparency, protecting our most vulnerable residents, preserving our tree canopy

Hello, neighbors! I hope you're enjoying the summer and spending some time in our beautiful parks and green spaces. I know my pups are enjoying the longer walks and extended outdoor playtime!

I wanted to take a few minutes to catch you up on some of the latest bills I've introduced to keep our communities thriving.

Cutting the red tape to report fraud, waste, and abuse

To cut the red tape related to reporting allegations of fraud, waste, or abuse of state funds, I am working on establishing a state-wide whistleblower office. The office would maintain a 24/7 hotline and online reporting system, allowing residents to submit reports anonymously if they choose and to include documentation and evidence to support their claims.

Creating a single, easily accessible method for reporting would make it easier for people to pick up the phone when they see or suspect something is wrong – and help the state appropriately address allegations of these crimes.

Protecting our most vulnerable residents

For people unable to make complex life decisions because of advanced age, illness, or disability, nothing is more important than having a caring, qualified guardian who can act in their best interest. Unfortunately, guardianship proceedings are not widely publicized under current state law, which can prevent word from reaching the best person for the job.

To fix that, I've introduced legislation that would expand the list of people entitled to receive notice of a guardianship petition and hearing. By casting a wider net, we can help ensure that a court has the best possible candidates to consider. The House unanimously passed the bill in May, and it is now awaiting consideration in the state Senate.

Preserving our tree canopy

For urban communities like ours, the tree cover provides precious benefits, from producing shade that lowers energy costs to reducing stormwater runoff and air pollution, to raising property values and increasing pedestrian traffic for local businesses.

After residents and environmental advocates expressed concern that trees were being removed unnecessarily, rather than simply trimmed or pruned, I introduced legislation to help preserve the tree canopy. My bill would require electric utilities that remove a tree to plant a new one, within two years, in a location of the municipality's choice. The bill recently advanced from committee and is awaiting full consideration in the House.

A note from the real estate tax collector...

Any unpaid 2025 Edgewood Borough real estate tax is due at penalty and will be turned over to the delinquent tax collector at the end of December. Please send your payments to Jordan Tax Service, Inc. by December 31 to avoid any additional penalties. Checks should be made out to the Borough of Edgewood.

The 2025 Woodland Hills School tax is also due at penalty unless you are paying in installments. The first installment was due October 31. The second installment is due January 31, 2026 and the final installment due March 31, 2026. Checks should be made out to Woodland Hills School District.
